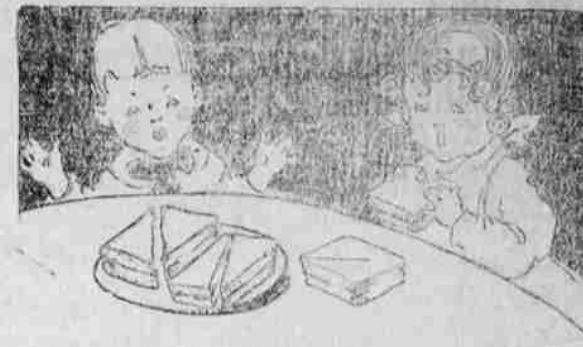

Sandwich Treats Instead of Sweets

Chocolate Sandwiches
For the filling make an icing, using one and a half tablespoons of cocoa, two tablespoons hot water and sufficient confectioners sugar to thicken. Into this stir one-half cup chopped walnut meats.

Raisin and Peanut Butter
Use equal quantities of raisins and peanut butter. Chop raisins medium fine and blend them with the peanut butter and a small amount of plain butter. Spread between slices of whole wheat or white bread; cut very thin.

Fig Sandwiches, Rolled

Bread for rolled sandwiches should be very fresh. A few hours before cutting wrap the loaf in a napkin wrung out of hot water and outside of that a heavy dry towel. Cut in thinnest possible slices, using a sharp knife, and butter lightly. Make a filling of the soft portion of a fresh fig, rubbed to a paste. Spread and roll as for a jelly-roll cake. Hold in place by toothpick at each end which should be removed just before serving; if desired to with baby ribbon.

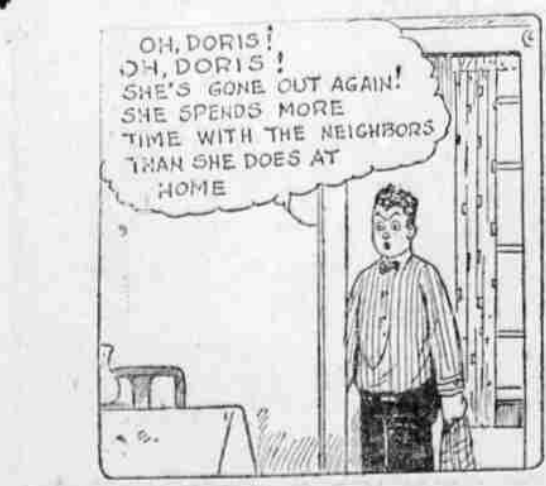
