SHERRYS TODAY AND WEDNESDAY

A picturesque and exciting romance of the South Seas is presented at the Sherry theatre in Goldwyn's "Lost and Found," written by Carey Wilson, and Goldwyn's editorial department, and directed by R. A. Walsh. This is the picture to make which Goldwyn sent the entire cast and a load of equipment to Tahiti. The action takes place on that island and on board the ship of the notorious slave trader, Captain Blackbird, acted by House Peters. The story is brimful of action, the island settings and the photography are unusually beautiful, the direction masterly and the acting most able and natural.

"Lost and Found" is the only photoplay for which the entire cast was ever sent to a South Sea island location. All of the scenes, with the exception of some of the interiors, were photographed in Tahiti, and on board a ship chartered for the purpose of the picture. Director Walsh had several big mob scenes in which several thousand natives took part to handle and he succeeded in getting some of the best managed and most thrilling mob scenes ever staged.

The story concerns a wealthy planter named Cochran whose wife despises him for the island governor and takes her oldest daughter, Lorna with her, leaving the baby, Madge. The latter is crippled as the result of an accident due to the mother's haste to leave. Cochran becomes embittered, swears vengeance upon all women and takes to the seas as Captain Blackbird, in command of a slave ship. Years later the woman and her daughter are deserted by the governor. Blackbird comes in contact with his daughter, not knowing who she is. He forcibly marries her to Dingo, the scoundrelly mate on his ship before discovering her identity. When he learns she is his daughter he refuses to let her go and Dingo brings on a terrific fight between the whites and the natives on the boat.

Goldwyn has made a big superlative of "Lost and Found," a photoplay that is bound to rank among the finest achievements of the season. The cast contains the names of a half a dozen of Hollywood's leading players-House Peters as Captain Blackbird, Rosemary Theby as his wife, Pauline Starkey as Lorna; George Seigmund as the governor, Antonio Moreno as the American hero, Carl Harbaugh, Mary Jane Irving, William V. Mong and David Wing have excellent roles.
