AQUA PROJECT NEARING END

(By Associated Press) SPOKANE, Wash., June 11.—Final government report on the practicability of the \$250,000,000 Columbia Basin irrigation project, under which it is proposed to reclaim approximately 2,000,000 acres of arid lands in southeastern Washington, is expected to be ready for submission to congress when the next session convenes in December.

The present investigation is the third survey of the project since its inception four and one-half years ago. After E. F. Blaine of Seattle had laid before the late Governor F. Lister a proposal for diversion of waters of Pend Oreille lake, in northern Idaho, for irrigating a large tract in the Columbia River Basin the Washington legislature in 1919 appropriated \$100,000 for a preliminary survey by state engineers.

After the commission had made a favorable report, the state in February, 1922, employed Major General George W. Goodrich to make a further investigation and report on the feasibility of the project from an engineering and economics standpoint. He also made a favorable report.

Operating independently of the state and the federal government for completion of the project, but working in co-operation with both, the Columbia Basin Irrigation League was organized at Pasco, Wash., in April, 1922. The present program of the league, which is controlled by a board of directors comprising representatives of the four Pacific northwestern states, contemplates raising a fund of \$200,000 for conducting a campaign of education to obtain federal backing for completion of the project.

Of the 2,000,000 acres of land included in the project, 1,750,000 is classified as first class land capable of being placed under gravity irrigation. About 250,000 acres are susceptible of being watered by slight pumping or are partly available to gravity irrigation, engineers' reports show. The land is situated in Franklin, Adams, Grant and Walla Walla counties in Washington, about 75 miles from Spokane, 120 miles from Seattle and 160 miles from Portland.

Cost of the completed project, including several lateral canals, has been estimated at \$250,000,000, which would make the average cost per acre \$147 to \$171. This estimate was based on costs of materials and labor during the high prices of 1921, and engineers since have stated that the new cost probably would not average more than \$125. The annual maintenance cost has been figured at forty-eight cents an acre. Seven years would be required for completion of the project.

Construction work will extend for 155 miles from Newport, Idaho, the point of diversion of the water to Pasco, Wash., the point of distribution. The water would be carried for a part of the distance in a canal ninety feet wide and sixty feet deep, capable of an average flowage rate of twelve miles an hour.

In the course of transmission from Lake Pend Oreille, the water would be carried past a large diversion dam at Albany Falls on the Pend Oreille river, through six smaller lakes, each with an impounding dam and seven tunnels. One of these latter would penetrate a residence section of Spokane.

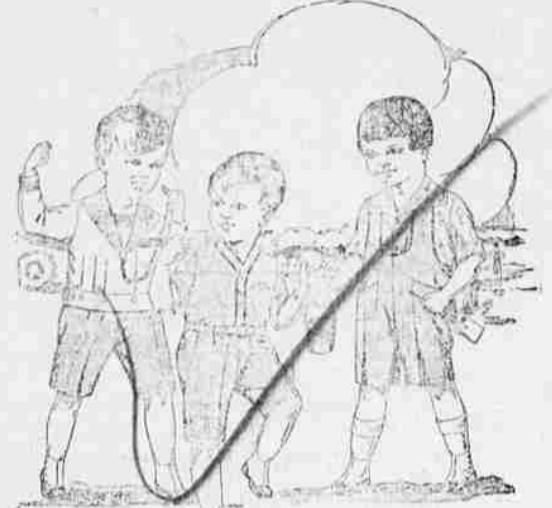
