Sportsmen To Declare War On "Killers"

Plans to Exterminate Predatory Birds and Animals in Eastern Oregon.

A movement is under way to protect the birds and animals in shooting game by exterminating the birds and animals which prey upon them. Plans are being made to make every sportsman interested in game protection, spend some time riding woods, field and marsh of predatory birds, cats and crows; weasels and others who annually kill ten thousand more game than all game laws combined. It has been stated that the red squirrel alone will kill 200 birds a season, while the great horned owl destroys annually over 1000 game birds. Special efforts are being made to exterminate the owl, the crow and the raven, which are described as destroying individuals more birds of all kinds, more birds' eggs and young poultry than any other bird that ever flapped a wing.

All game destroying animals and birds are classed by sportsmen and game lovers as vermin, and it is expected that various hunting clubs can be organized here and that members of established gun clubs will join in the movement by going into the woods and shooting as many game destroyers as they can find.

Crows are especially pestiferous in Eastern Oregon and measures will be taken to poison them—which will not only rid the sportsman of a pest but also the farmer.

"This is a call to every sportsman," states Al Andrews, secretary of the club, "to get busy and kill every hawk, crow, raven, etc., with the view of protecting both our game supply and the domestic birds and animals."

RITCHIE GRANTED LICENSE
NEW YORK, June 13.—Wille Ritchie, christened Geary A. Steffin, former world lightweight boxing champion, is back in the pugilistic lists, seeking to gather a bit of the fame he knew before Freddie Welsh took the title from him in a 20-round engagement in London in 1914. The former champion Tuesday obtained from the state athletic commission a license to box.

Ritchie became titleholder in 1912 when Referee Jim Griffin awarded him the decision over Ad Wolgast on a foul in the sixteenth round of their engagement. He lost the crown to Welsh on a decision by Referee Eugene Corri after 20 rounds of milling at the Olympia in London. Welsh dropped the title to Benny Leonard, present holder. Leonard halted an attempted comeback by Ritchie in 1919 at Newark, N. J., knocking out the San Franciscan in the eighth round.
