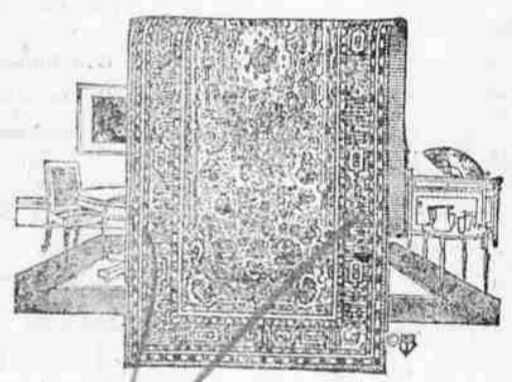

NATIONAL DEBT OF POLAND
(By Associated Press)
WARSAW, June 13.—The debt of the Polish government in the state of the Polish State Loan Bank is indicated as 2,161,500,000,000 Polish marks on April 22, or an increase during April of 409,500,000,000.

The amount of paper money issued by the State Loan Bank was 2,222,200,734,558 Polish marks. Thus the issue during April was 491,191,171,003 Polish marks.

Mental Athletics

Oxford university will send a debating team from England to this country to meet teams drawn from a half a dozen of our American universities this year. The collegiate minds of this country have been pitted against the collegiate minds of another before, but few people have heard about the contests. Once again it is certain that this international contest of mental athletics will not receive so much attention as the many contests of physical athletes receive.

In time, perhaps, since people are realizing more and more the value of education, these mental games may be as frequent and as much known as the physical ones. Both are of value, of course, but colleges have been giving the physical battles attention out of proportion to their importance. It is debatable, of course, whether this condition can be changed, but it is worth consideration. America owes an increase of appreciation to mental development.

Up To Motorists

American railroads are planning another summer drive against the reckless driver at grade crossings. The campaign will run from June 1 to September 1, a period of the year marked by reddest trail of blood.

During the same period a year ago, 758 persons were killed and 1902 injured in grade crossing accidents, an increase over the previous year of 11 per cent. Safety advocates find some comfort in the comparison because while rail traffic increased 11 per cent, motor vehicles increased 17 per cent.

No person seriously disputes that the vast majority of grade crossing accidents are the result of carelessness on the part of the victims. The practice is obvious to any observer at these points. Since all crossings cannot be eliminated at once, caution must be taught. And that is difficult in a rush-a-day world, but it is a lesson for every motorist to master.

Going Too Far

Extremism is the curse of the age. That too much of a good thing becomes bad is apparently beyond the realization of many individuals. Progressivism is a good thing, but carried too far, it becomes mere silly foolhardiness. Nationalism is a good thing but it can be carried to an imprudent extreme, in which ignorance supplants patriotism.

Common sense should be used in progressiveness and nationalism. Temperance is called for at this time when this nation, along with the rest of the world, is faced by unrest. Progressivism and nationalism can serve their purpose only if they stay within the bounds of common sense and the real meaning of the terms.

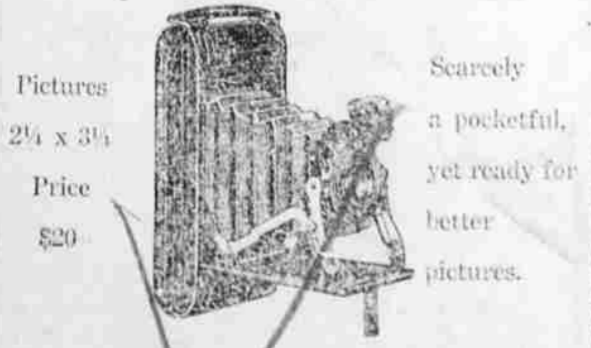
Through Gorge of The Cascades
