## Rocco Boxes Both Gibbons And Dempsey

### Sparling Partner. After Meeting Both Men, Says Dempsey Hits Harder, But Gibbons Offener.

SHELBY, Mont., June 14.—"Dempsey hit me harder. Gibbons hit me twice as often."

There's a whole sermon in that statement. Within the last week Rocco Simoni—170-pound Italian has boxed both the defender and the contender who stood at the heavyweight title in the Shelby shed July Fourth. Rocco is a hometown fighter here. A few days ago Jack Kearns pulled him in to Great Falls to do some catching for the Champ. Dempsey cracked the lid a few. Rocco got round-and-round. The sparring partner brushed Dempsey's eye. It was a nasty cut.

Like a hurt animal Dempsey got rough—and mad, too. He floored Rocco. The Italian leaped from the floor and socked Dempsey again. Kearns stopped the proceedings.

Rocco was sent back to Shelby. Eddie Kane promptly hired him to work with Gibbons.

After working with both Dempsey and Gibbons the lad analyzed his taste of experience with heavy artillery.

"I found Dempsey wide open," he says. "I didn't have any trouble hitting them in there. Gibbons is a lot harder to hit. He makes you miss with his connects."

"Dempsey slugged me harder because he was trying to knock me out. But he didn't. I didn't mean to hurt his eye. A sparring partner isn't supposed to do much to the man he is boxing but give a good exhibition."

"Dempsey stung me and I stung back."

"Kearns claimed I hit Dempsey. I don't think I did. We were at close range when I landed on his eye."

"After boxing Gibbons I have changed my mind about him not having a chance against the Champ."

"Dempsey hit me hardest because we were fighting."

"But Gibbons hit me twice to Dempsey's one and I couldn't hit him squarely."

"I don't suppose my opinion amounts to much because I am just a sparring partner."

"Gibbons had me dizzy from so many punches. I was weaker after a couple of rounds with him than I was when with Dempsey."

"Gibbons keeps popping you with a left hand. He beats you to the punch so you can't start or get your balance."

"Judging from my experience with both I am convinced of this: Dempsey is going to see a lot of gloves when he comes to Shelby."

"My clash with Dempsey turned out to be a regular fight—with Gibbons it was boxing."

## Monterey Wins Polo Title From Boise

BOISE, June 14.—Boise's civilian polo team for the first time in three years, Wednesday afternoon lost the Boise Polo Club cup, symbol of the northwestern polo championship, when the Eleventh cavalry quarter from Monterey, Cal., slaughtered the locals, 16 to 2. ## SHELBY NOW A CITY OF 7,000 PEOPLE

SHELBY, Mont., Lake a huge jolly fish Shelby is expanding hourly. Originally a town of a few hundred persons it has become almost overnight a noisy boom city of more than 7,000.

Its one dusty main street is choked with hurrying humanity at all hours of the day. Shacks and tent colonies are springing up like mushrooms. A midway with rag doll galleries, soft drink parlors and restaurants is under construction. Shanty structures are blossoming into hotels or possession stumps and every available foot of frontage on the main-street boasts of a commercial enterprise of some kind.

### Tents and Crackerbox Houses.

One long tentacle of the jolly fish stretches northward from town. Crude crackerbox buildings and tents occupy its entire length. At its terminus to the right again, now almost completed, where thousands will gather July 4 for the Jack Dempsey-Tom Gibbons fight at which a champion will be dethroned or a challenger conquered.
