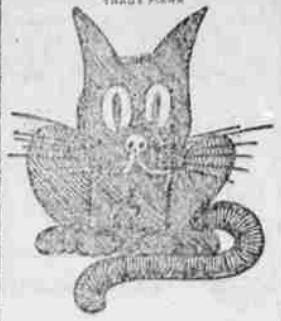

The Flag

One hundred and forty-six years ago today congress adopted a flag for the United States. That emblem of American liberties and national life has undergone many regroupings, but it still remains the banner with the starry field and alternate strippings of red and white. In all its history it has never been trailed in the dust of defeat. The sight of it inspired the soldier in the War of the Revolution, in the nation's second war with Britain, on the cactus plains of Mexico, and the upholder of the Union in the Civil war. Those enlisted under its folds put the pirates of the Barbary Coast out of business and humbled the once proud Spain. It waved over those who went to assist in the suppression of Hun "kultur" and it was borne triumphantly home when the fighting ended in driving the invaders from Flanders fields.

It always has stood for liberty and equality of opportunity and it stands for that still. The liberty it represents is not license, but freedom under the law, as expressed in the will of the majority. Never has that flag meant more to the world than it means today. Americans may be proud that it has always been carried with honor on the field of battle, but the accomplishments of peace over which it has waved have been greater than those of martial glory. Pride should lie in that the flag has flown over a nation devoted to construction rather than the opposite, over a people not military but peace-loving, builders for the good of all, not favor to the few.

Not all who have lived and prospered under the American form of government have shown appreciation of its benefits. Some would tear it down and erect a Soviet Russia with all the horrors of that sort of regime in its stead. It is fitting, therefore, that Flag Day should be observed by organizations of patriotic purpose to instill and renew appreciation of what government means under the flag loyal Americans honor above life itself. A recanting of what the flag represents will inspire youth to honor the emblem and it will renew in those of maturer years fealty to the banner under which they live.


