TO SHOW AUTO PICTURE SOON

The Story of an Automobile, a moving picture that will be shown at the Star Theatre is alive with human interest.

Machine representing the last word in manufacturing efficiency performs spectacular operations of almost every conceivable description.

Red hot steel is forged into shafts by a few blows from giant steam hammers. Molten metal is cast into intricate designs. This film was produced under the direction of the United States Department of Commerce in cooperation with The Stribaker Corporation and will be shown in all parts of the world. It was photographed in the new \$2,000,000 Stribaker plant at South Bend, Indiana.

The story is told in an inspiring and simple way and shows, in an intensely interesting manner, the many operations used in the building of an automobile. The picture follows the assembly line with units added in logical order, each unit being traced through its manufacture before the next is applied.

This motion picture is even more interesting than a trip through the factory because many details which escape the eye are caught by the camera.
