### LUMBER DEMAND IS PICKING UP

Further slight improvement in demand for lumber has been generally reported this week, but wholesale trade remains decidedly spotty, says the American Lumberman, Chicago. Buying by retail yards is mostly confined to small lots for rush shipments to meet immediate needs, and little disposition to replenish the steadily declining stocks is shown. However, distributors do not believe dealers can remain out of the market much longer, in view of the excellent trade which the dealers continue to transact.

Industrial demand also is quiet, but is showing signs of picking up, particularly in hardwoods. The call for the latter from flooring and interior manufacturers has dropped off considerably of late, but an improvement has been noted in trade with musical instrument, agricultural implement and vehicle manufacturers, while the carbuilders and car builders have recently broadened their buying activities. Automobile and furniture interests are poor customers, though the latter are showing more interest and are expected to come into the market on a large scale after the midsummer shows, by which time their stocks will be near exhaustion. There is still a very good demand for lower grades for box and crating purposes and prices for this material are relatively stronger than those of upper grades. The export demand is a feature in both the hardwood and softwood markets, being well maintained, at good prices.

The price situation is without material change from last week, though considerable additional shading here and there is reported. This, however, is largely in cases where mills have accumulated surplus of certain items and are eager to move them. Stocks everywhere are much below normal and order files are still considerably filled. In view of this, and of the prospective early resumption of active demand, it is freely predicted that the price recession has already gone about as far as it can, and that quotations will soon react upward.

Conditions on the west coast and in the inland Empire remain conducive to a heavy output, but those in the South, particularly in the Mississippi Valley hardwood territory, are still such as severely to curtail production.

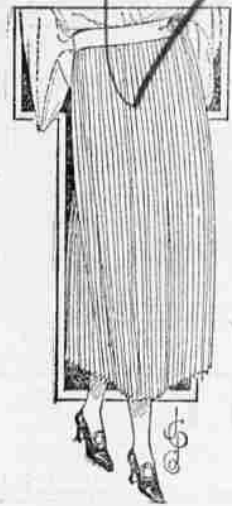
