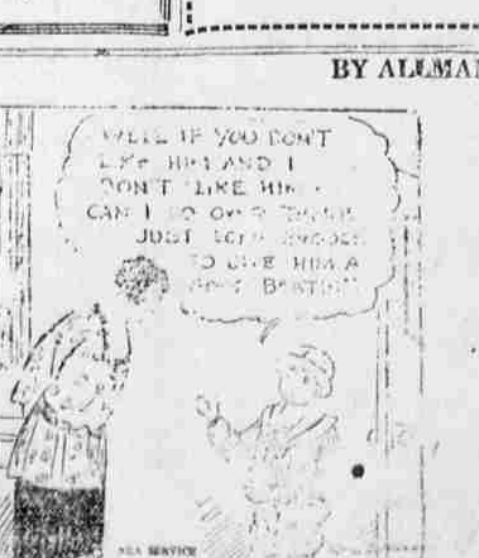

## SHERRY'S LAST DAY

Cast Adds Much To New Feature.  
"The Girl Who Came Back" from Forman's elaborate screen version of the stage production of the same title, proved a completely satisfying offering at the Sherry theatre where it had its local premiere last evening. It is difficult to select any one individual from a company of such uniform brilliance for praise. Miss Cooper and Harlan given the advantage of especially sympathetic roles, easily won the hearts of the audience, while Gaston Glass and Malatesta, even as bad men of the screen, succeeded in injecting so much of human nature into their parts as to make the on-looker, momentarily, forget that his sympathies were elsewhere. Both Za Su Pitts and Ethel Shannon took every advantage of the comedy possibilities of their roles. Mr. Dowling, beloved of the screen's great players, was as convincing in the role of a "life terner" as he was in the role of "The Minute Man".
