**LOOKING FOR LOCAL
WHEAT HARVESTERS**

SPokane, Wash., June 21.—The Spokane central labor council is planning a movement to obtain sufficient labor locally to harvest the wheat crop of the Spokane country, according to Carl Evans, president.

"We don't want to see thousands of men brought in and left jobless after the harvest," Mr. Evans said. "It would be better to tackle the harvest with workers of our own district. It reports indicate that the crops will be heavy and all of us want the harvest to be thorough and successful."

Arthur E. Lewis, head of the labor committee of the Chamber of Commerce, recently told the city commissioners that ten thousand hands will be required in the Inland Empire between July 10 and August 15 if the bumper crops in prospect are to be harvested. He asked that local contractors be allowed further time to complete work so that local laborers will be released for work in the harvest fields. Mr. Lewis fears a shortage of harvest help if there is not an influx of labor.

**LEVIATHAN IS
NOW UNDERWAY**

Giant Liner, Carrying Hundreds of Guests, Is on Trial Trip to West Indian Waters.

Aboard the Steamship Leviathan, June 21.—Uncle Sam's big yachting party, aboard the reconitioned Leviathan, was howling along at a 19-knot-an-hour clip at the first reading of the log early Wednesday, as the nation's biggest liner steamed her way on her trial trip to West Indian waters.

The guests are said not to exceed 450, although the list had not yet been compiled.

Albert D. Lasker, retiring chairman of the shipping board, and others officially connected with the cruise, did not appear before their guests until the vessel was under way. Gossip among the passengers had it that they were in retirement because of rumors that an eleventh-hour attempt would be made to enjoin the trip.

So smoothly did the giant slide along that many of the passengers were unaware that she was under way until a half hour or more after leaving Boston harbor.

The commissioners in charge of the trip held a long session with members of the trial board Tuesday night, and agreed on all details of the test program. It is largely technical, dealing with the intricacies of cuisine, machinery, speed and the vessel's general behavior under various conditions.

In all guest rooms have been placed printed cards requesting that complaints of any and all kinds concerning the ship's service and appointments be filed with the officials in writing. With these aids, combined with the observations of the technical experts aboard, it is designed to make the Leviathan the most meticulously appointed passenger vessel in the United States service.
