## Pirates Idle For 2 Weeks

### Baker Is Unwilling to give La Grande a Chance to Get into Action Before July 8th.

Union's withdrawal from the Intermountain Baseball league has resulted in La Grande facing a distinct disadvantage in at least one respect. The Pirates were scheduled to meet the Federals Sunday and July 1 and by forfeiting to La Grande, Union put the Pirates on a two weeks vacation, which is not conducive to maintaining the playing qualities of the team at top-notch.

Efforts are being made by manager W. C. Crews to induce Cove and Baker to postpone their game scheduled for July in favor of a game with La Grande on that date so as to do away with a two weeks layoff and even up matters equally among the three teams remaining. As the matter now stands Baker has three regular scheduled games in the next three weeks and Cove two. Baker plays La Grande July 8 and her schedule then comes to a close with not a single layoff, inasmuch as her series with Union was dated July 15 and 22.

By playing La Grande July 1 each team would take but one week off which would be fair all around. A communication received from G. T. Hunt, manager of the Celts, read: "I put up to the boys the matter of putting off the Cove-Baker game and they all were opposed to doing so. So we will play at Cove June 24th and Cove at Baker July 1st and Baker at La Grande July 8th as per schedule."

And so it throws La Grande into a nice, two weeks hole with nothing to keep the pitching arms and baseball muscles functioning or from growing stale.

Baker is perfectly willing to let La Grande stay idle while she closes her season without a layoff—from all appearances. That makes it nice for Baker.

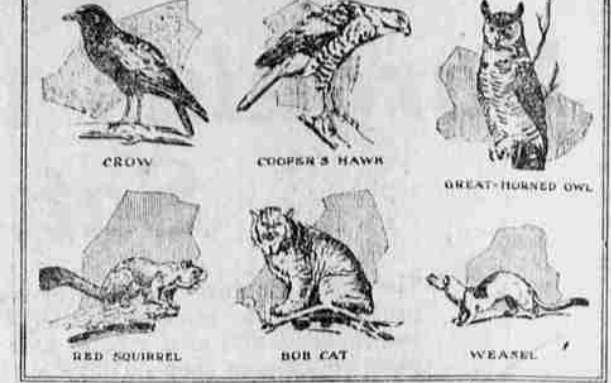

## Sportsmen and Farmers Join In Shooting 'Vermin' to Save Game

### HERE ARE THE GAME-KILLERS!



The birds and animals shown above are among the most voracious that prey on game and young poultry. They hunt in season and out of season and, with others of their kind, annually kill ten times as much game as all the sportsmen in the country combined.

A COUNTRY-WIDE campaign is now on to preserve the game of the country by keeping down the number of predatory animals and birds which prey on useful species. The Cooper's hawk, sharp-shinned hawk, goshawk and great horned owl, feed almost exclusively on quail, partridge and other game and useful birds. The crow annually destroys millions of the eggs and young of birds, during the nesting season. It has been stated that each crow steals eleven eggs or young of birds during that time.

A red squirrel, it has been estimated, each year eats some 300 of the eggs of useful feathered creatures. The ordinary house cat, when vagrant, is a voracious hunter of useful birds of all species. In fact, naturalists say that the game killing animals and birds account for ten times as much game as all the hunters of the country combined.

The American Game Protective and Propagation Association has issued a call to all game conservation workers throughout the country to join in a campaign to shoot the predatory game killers, which are known to sportsmen as "vermin." There has been a gen-

eral response. Campaigns have already been started or are about to be started in the states of Alabama, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Georgia, Iowa, Kansas, Maryland, Michigan, Missouri, Montana, New York, Ohio, Oregon, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, Vermont, Virginia, Washington.

Gun clubs, farmers, individual sportsmen and all lovers of game are being urged at this time to go afield and shoot the marauders whose depredations now are at their worst because the young birds are at their most helpless age. In some states anti-crow and anti-hawk campaigns have been instituted by the authorities. In others, gun clubs are holding anti-vermin contests among their members.

In certain states bigger bounties have been declared against certain species of "vermin." The American Game Protective and Propagation Association, backed by the farmers and sportsmen of the country, expects that the results of the shooting of predatory birds and animals, at this time, will be reflected in the fall shooting. If the campaign is successful, more protection than ever will be given game birds of all kinds.
