Ho! for Summer Sandwiches



Make ready the desired number of pieces of toast. Prepare each sandwich as follows: Place a lettuce leaf on one of the slices; sprinkle over it a teaspoonful of salad dressing; add the sliced chicken; put on a little more lettuce and dressing; then the bacon and tomato, and more lettuce and dressing. Finish with the second slice of toast. Cut the sandwich diagonally. Garnish with very small lettuce leaves or parsley and serve at once.

Hot Chicken Sandwiches. Cut bread in slices one-quarter inch thick. Spread lightly with creamed butter and lay on thin slices of chicken. Sprinkle on a little celery salt. Press the second slice of bread in place; toast on either side and when finished butter the toasted surfaces.

Jelly Sandwiches. Spread buttered slices with currant jelly and sprinkle with chopped English walnut meats. Trim crusts and cut slices in half diagonally. Put jam or marmalade sandwich between the middle sections, omitting the nut meats.

Outing Sandwiches. Prepare the desired number of slices of bread and butter lightly. Peel one or two sweet apples, core, and slice very thin. Place a layer of apple on the bottom slice, then a generous spread of creamed butter and another layer of the apple and press top slice firmly in place.
