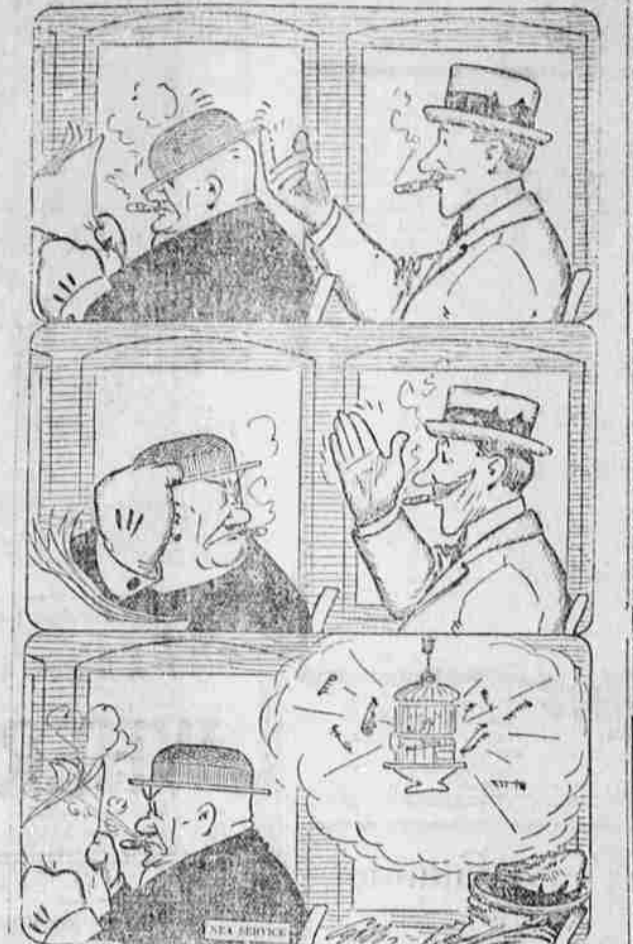

M'CULLY NOW IN CHARGE OF BANK

ENTERPRISE, June 23. — P. D.
McCully received his commission yester-
day from the comptroller of the
currency at Washington, as receiver
of the First National bank of Joseph-
eph. A telegram last Thursday
morning advised him of his appoint-
ment and since then he has been
engaged with Examiner B. K. Pat-
terson, getting the run of the bank's
affairs. Mr. Patterson has left for
the east and the receiver is now in
full charge.

As stated last week, the receiver

necessarily will seek to protect all
interests. It is his business to col-
lect the notes and not to sacrifice
them by trying to force payment.
Mr. McCully knows every man in
community and is admirably qual-
ified for the duties of his position.

He is now advertising for sale
farm lands and equipment, horses,
cattle and other stock. These were
in the hands of the bank when it
was closed and have not been taken
in since then. Nobody has been closed
out. That is not the policy of the
receiver any more than of a banker.
