But the Sandwich hits the spot!

You know how it is, fellows; pop-corn and apples and all-day suckers are good enough in their way, but when it comes to a downright good lunch—for that after-school hunger, there's nothing quite hits the spot like a boxful of good sandwiches! Try these next time hunger hits you:

Mash one cream cheese and add two tablespoons of marmalade and one tablespoon of finely chopped walnuts. Mix thoroughly and spread between buttered slices of whole wheat, graham or white bread.

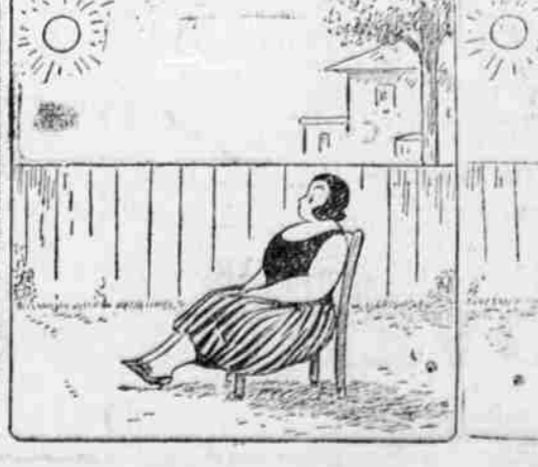
