ACTOR RISKS LIFE FLAGGING 'TRAIN IN 'THE GO-GETTER'

Dying death when he flagged an express train traveling at a speed of forty miles an hour. T. Giving the express a looney of fifteen feet, Barnes jumped to safety just as the wondrous engine swept by, covering him with dust. The emergency brake had been set by the engine driver and the train came to a halt within fifty yards. The director remonstrated with Barnes for his daring, but the actor merely laughed at the incident.

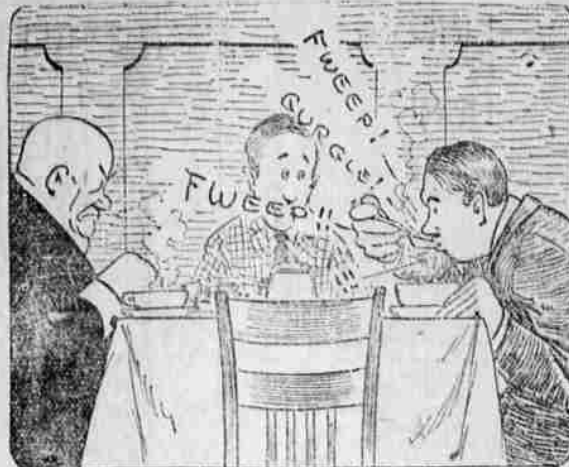

Tea-time is Sandwich time

For the sweet sand which serves nicely for a dessert - use in a lady, jam, jelly or a y. courtesy not too liquid. Here's a suggestion:

Spread buttered slices with currant jelly and a sprig of English walnut meats. Fill with cream and cut slices in half, diagonally.

Tea and light sandwiches make a pleasant brace to tide you over until the evening meal is served. Chat goes so well over the tea-cups that everywhere tea-time has come to be the most popular hour for informal friendly hospitality.

Savory Sandwiches

Blanch almonds, and brown one-half cup in cooking oil placed in a skillet. Chop fine. Season well with salt and paprika and add two tablespoons of chopped pickles and one tablespoon chopped chutney. Cream one large egg yolk and spread on thin slices of bread. Sprinkle with the almond mixture and press top slice of bread into place. Cut in triangle shapes.
