MICUTCHON'S NOVEL "TRUXTON KING" MAKES VIVID PICTURE

It has been said of some critics that they write with pens that are over-keen—that the dics pierce through the newsprint. No matter how harsh the judgments may be, they must give a mood of praise to "Truxton King," the Fox production starring John Gilbert, which begins a two day run at the Star tonight. George Harry Micutchon's novel was exciting reading, but this film makes each character stand out in the flesh.

John Gilbert's moments of comedy were many and refreshing. His dramatic efforts were convincingly well done. He does some sword fighting, the equal of his blade work in "Monte Cristo." To show that he is an adept at several sports, Gilbert obliges the screen audience with a high dive from a castle wall into a moat. But the delicacy with which he handles the love scenes, often made a travesty by others less experienced, stamps his art as a true achievement.

Tea-time is Sandwich time
