Interesting Problem Treated in Wm. de Mille's Picture "Only 38."

One of life's deepest problems—Shall a widow of thirty-eight or forty renounce all hope of another love romance in order to obey the wishes of her children, almost grown?—forms the basis of William de Mille's Paramount production of "Only 38." "Although, as the daughter in "Only 38," I oppose my mother's romance following the death of my father, I would never think of such a thing actually," says Miss McAvoy. "A mother has the same right to romance as her children. If she thinks it wrong to marry, believing it a disrespect to her dead husband, then she should act as she thinks best. At most, it should not be the business of her children to judge for her. On the other hand, the children would soon marry themselves, automatically leaving the mother alone. Unselfish children naturally think of this beforehand."

Tea-time is Sandwich time
 Tea and light sandwiches make a pleasant bracer to tide you over until the evening meal is served. Chat goes so well over the tea-cups that everywhere tea-time has come to be the most popular hour for informal friendly hospitality.

Make your tea sandwiches dainty both in size and kind, without crusts. Fillings should be smooth and delicate, preferably of lettuce and mayonnaise-watercress, chopped olives, minced chicken or turkey. Here is something new that will appeal:

Jelly Sandwiches
 For the sweet sandwich—which serves nicely for a dessert—use as a filling a lady, jam, jelly or a n y conserve not too liquid. Here's a suggestion:
 Spread buttered slices with currant jelly, a n d sprinkle with chopped English walnut meats. Trim crusts and cut slices in half diagonally.

Savory Sandwiches
 Blanch almonds, and brown one-half cup in cooking oil placed in a skillet. Chop fine. Season well with salt and paprika and add two tablespoons of chopped pickles and one tablespoon chopped chutney. Cream one large egg, measure and spread on thin slices of bread. Sprinkle with the almond mixture and press top slice of bread into place. Cut in triangle shapes.

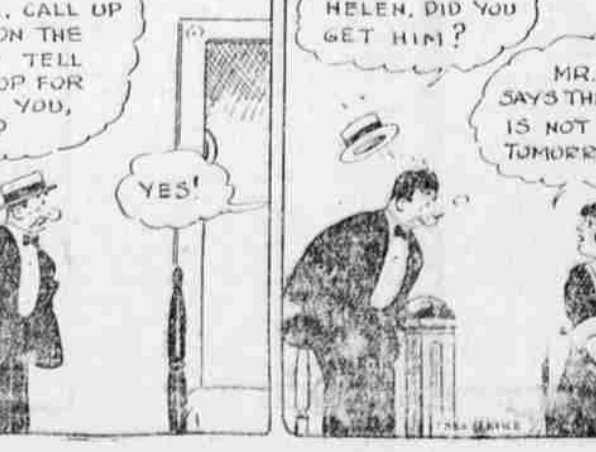
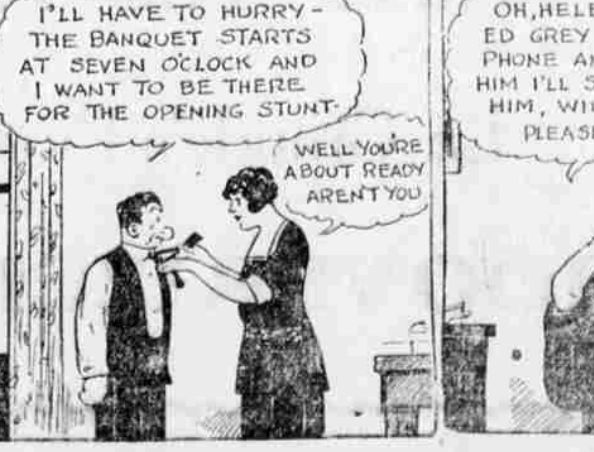
