WHEELER GIVES WORD OF PRAISE

President Harding Is Upheld by Attorney for the Anti-Saloon League of America.

(By the Associated Press)
 DES MOINES, July 5.—President Harding was praised by Wayne B. Wheeler of Washington, attorney for the anti-saloon league of America in his address before the 29th International Christian Endeavor convention in session here Wednesday night. Mr. Wheeler's address was on "Patriotism's Challenge for Law and Order."
 "If the teachers of our next generation do not witness the downfall of orderly liberty and the rule of right and see a return to anarchy and the rule of might, Christian Endeavor can and must help to create the sentiment that will make scoffing at the United States Constitution unpopular," said Mr. Wheeler. "President Harding was right in his challenge to New York state recently when he reminded them of Lincoln's great pronouncement that a nation could not remain half-slave and half free, nor can it at this

If you like the law or not, as long as it is regularly adopted it is our business to obey it. President Harding said also that if every man thinks every law must suit him in order to obey it, he is not a democrat but an anarchist.

Mr. Wheeler appealed to all the delegates from foreign countries to use their influence in their respective countries to prevent their countries from being used as a base for defying the prohibition laws of the United States. Every province of Canada is represented at the convention.
 "Let us remember that the liquor interests in Europe do not represent the best element in those nations," said Mr. Wheeler. "There is a growing minority in every nation of the world against the liquor traffic. All nations but two have their prohibition movements. My making good in the United States will aid every other nation in the world to hasten the day of final freedom."

 les of episodes depicting the coming of the first missionaries, Jason Lee and his Methodist band, Dr. and Mrs. Marcus Whitman who laid down their lives in the Whitman massacre; and Spaulding party of Presbyterians, and the Episcopalians lead by Bishop Scott.

A dozen or so covered wagons represented the first train of immigrants to cross the Blue mountains, passed before the president and then came the outstanding pioneers, Buffalo Bill, Kit Carson, John C. Fremont and a host of others.

Mrs. Harding cheered. The pageant ended, the Concord coach again drove up. This time Mrs. Harding insisted on riding with the driver and after being helped to the high seat rode away while the hills echoed with applause.
 Luncheon was a basket dinner, served by the women of the surrounding country in a big tent. Chicken, big red strawberries, large angel food cakes and roast beef were among the viands set before the visitors.

The president then went to the reviewing stand to deliver his address in which he paid tribute to the spirit and the achievements of the pioneers.
