BETHEL, July 6. (AP)—Taxicab fares in Berlin are now seven thousand times the number of marks registered on the taximeters.

Taxicab drivers all carry printed tables showing the totals the multiple produces with various possible registrations on the indicator.

Every time the multiple is changed there is needless confusion, and many disputes ensue which the police are often called upon to settle.

Clerks in shops are provided with similar tables. In every trade an agreement is arranged as to the multiple which will be used in computing the price of articles in depreciated paper marks, as against the gold-mark price.
