 SPOKANE, Wash., July 7.—Spokane's new Brotherhood Co-operative National bank is expected to open the last week in July, the recently-elected officers say.

## Wrecked Automobile Is Salvaged From River

 SPOKANE, Wash., July 7.—A seven passenger automobile, wrecked and spilled into the Spokane river near here in a road accident, was recently salvaged after lying for four days under 20 feet of water.

The car was little damaged, considering its watery burial. Two spare tires, in addition to the four on the wheels, were fully inflated. Upon removal of the spark plugs, the air still compressed in the cylinders shot water several inches high. As a result of rolling about on the river bottom, it was found that the car had suffered breakage of the fenders, lights, top, and one spring.

## Building Fruit Warehouses

(By Associated Press)  
 SPOKANE, Wash., July 7.—Fruit warehouses to increase the storage capacity in north central Washington by at least 1000 cars are being rushed to completion, it is stated here. It is aimed to use the new

warehouses in protecting this season's apple crop.

A considerable portion of the loss on last year's crop could have been avoided if there had been sufficient storage space, it is said. With the new additions the total storage capacity will be increased to about 7500 cars. About 10 per cent of this is cold storage, and the rest is classed as ordinary storage.

## Plan to Clear Highway Boards of All Politics

 SPOKANE, Wash., July 7.—An intensive program to separate highway boards from partisan politics, insofar as possible, is due this year on the part of the Inland Automobile

association, according to Secretary Frank W. Guilbert. The Inland association is the local branch of the American Automobile association.

"Decisions to concentrate on this problem was reached after a study of statistics which showed that the highway departments of eighteen states have been radically changed in the past few months," Secretary Guilbert stated in announcing the program. "We feel that the building and maintenance of highways is of too great importance to be interrupted by a complete change in administration every few years."

**METAL MINING GROWS.**  
 (By the Associated Press)  
 RENO, Nev., July 7.—Nevada produced gold, silver, copper lead and zinc during 1922 valued at \$16,795,609 compared with \$12,137,536 in 1921, according to government statistics received here. Silver production increased 1,335,905 ounces, white gold declined 743 ounces.
