CHAPLIN HAS VETERAN CAST IN "THE PILGRIM"

Several players who contributed to past screen successes of Charles Chaplin support the famous comedian in his latest First National feature comedy "The Pilgrim" which is being shown at the Star Theatre today and Sunday.

SCENES IN "THE KINGDOM WITHIN" INSPIRES ACTORS

Actors as a rule are regarded more or less as proverbial wanderers. Any place they hang their hat is home, sweet home, to them. It is seldom that an actor, and particularly movie actors, have the privilege or the opportunity of taking their work right home with them. Movie players sometimes have to travel thousands of miles in the making of a picture. If the producer decides that the atmosphere must be as realistic as possible, a trip across the continent or even across the ocean, may be the result. For example, the picture may have something to do with a scene in Egypt, in which perhaps the Sphinx or the Pyramids may play a prominent part. In that case, it would be rather difficult to reproduce these in a way that would give the impression as being genuine. It, therefore, means that the picture must be filmed right on the ground, so the entire company of actors and actresses must necessarily be taken to Egypt. Costumes must be taken along, camera men, in fact, all of the paraphernalia and accessories required to do the work right there.

The action in this picture takes place in the midst of the big redwood trees in California. The locale is laid in the little town of Alden, which nestles in the shadow of the forests of Giant Redwood. Inasmuch as many of the players in the cast claim California for their home, it was a real old home week for most of the company during the filming of this picture.

When a director has a contented company, as must necessarily happen in a case like this, it makes his work much easier. One can readily understand what an important bearing the location of the picture has on the moods and temperament of the players. Mr. Schertinger says that never in his entire career as a director has he worked with a company that put so much enthusiasm into their work. The scenes are magnificent and give one an interesting and complete view of the famous redwoods of California. There redwoods are the largest trees in the world. Ten or a dozen men can easily stand on the stump of one. The famous tree in California where a tunnel has been cut right through and is large enough to permit a horse and carriage on an automobile to be driven through is interestingly shown. One of the features of the picture is the scene at the sawmill where these giant trees can be seen going through the skids and into the mill.

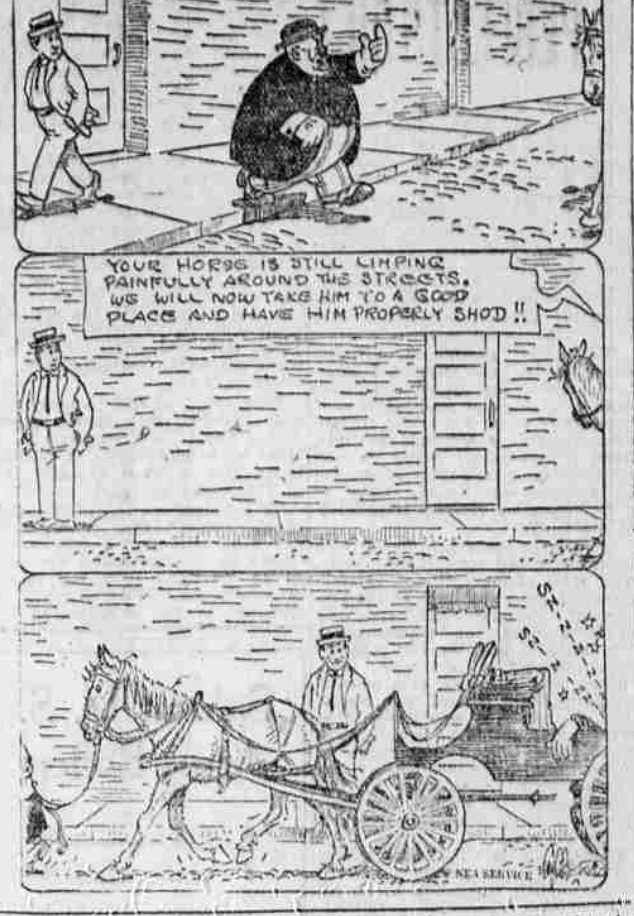
POPULAR STAGE PLAY ON SCREEN

Tea-time is Sandwich time

Tea and light sandwiches make a pleasant bracer to tide you over until the evening meal is served. Chat goes so well over the tea-cups that everywhere tea-time has come to be the most popular hour for informal friendly hospitality.

Make your tea sandwiches dainty both in size and kind, without crusts. Fillings should be smooth and delicate, preferably of lettuce and mayonnaise, watercress, chopped olives, minced chicken or turkey. Here is something new that will appeal:

Jelly Sandwiches

For the sweet and rich which serves nicely for a dessert—use as a r m a lady, jam, jelly or a y conserve not too liquid. Here's a suggestion:

Spread buttered slices with current jelly and sprinkle with chopped English walnut meats. Trim crusts and cut slices in half, diagonally.

Savory Sandwiches

Blanched almonds, and brown one-half cup in cooking oil placed in a skillet. Chop fine. Season well with salt and paprika and add two tablespoons of chopped pickles and one tablespoon chopped chutney. Cream one large egg yolk and spread on thin slices of bread. Sprinkle with the almond mixture and press top slice of bread into place. Cut in triangle shapes.
