MAGDEBURG, July 11.—Although Germany as a whole has been unable to float loans abroad, several of her industrial cities have been successful in doing so, the latest of these being Magdeburg.

It is announced that a banking consortium, including several foreign institutions, recently placed an 8 per cent Magdeburg loan of 1,000,000,000 marks in foreign countries. Most of it is said to have been taken up in the United States.

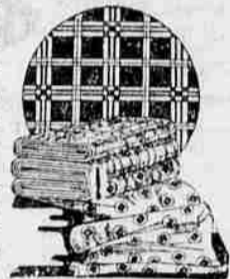
