Cove Versus La Grande Is Sunday Game

Diamond Rivals To Meet In La Grande In Third Game of Series This Year.

Cove versus La Grande. That caption never fails to draw the interest of baseball fans because when Cove and La Grande, ancient friendly enemies on the diamond, meet, a game worth watching is sure to result.

The Pirates and Farmers will meet in the third game of their four game 1923 series here Sunday afternoon at the fair-grounds at 2:30 o'clock. Incidentally, La Grande has only two more games to play, both of them with Cove, July 15 and 22. Baker and Cove will then close the official season with a post-season game which was postponed due to rain.

La Grande is one and one-half games behind the Farmers and by winning Sunday they would close the gap to one-half game. Then if, perchance, La Grande should repeat their performance the following week they would draw one-half a game ahead of Cove and would then be one-half game behind Baker. A three cornered tie would result if, in the post-season game, Cove should beat Baker. That is the only chance La Grande has of coming out of the race in the lead—by subsequently winning in a play-off that would result if that circumstance arose. It's just a fighting chance but the Pirates believe it is worth fighting for.

Honors About Even. The Intermountain league was started in 1922 and since that time Cove and La Grande have met six times in official games and one time in an exhibition game. Of the total La Grande won three and Cove three.

The following scores were registered: La Grande 10, Cove 9 (1922); Cove 10, La Grande 3 (1922); La Grande 8, Cove 6 (1922); Cove 3, La Grande 2 (1923); La Grande 11, Cove 8 (1923) and La Grande 6, Cove 7 (1923).

In those six games La Grande has scored 40 runs and Cove 49. Three of the games were won by the slight margin of one run and only one proved to be what is termed in baseball lingo as a massacre. On those records it can easily

be seen that both teams play close baseball.

La Grande has claimed some hard luck in the two official games with Cove this year and to back up this claim, La Grande has showed up better against Baker than has Cove. While Cove has only won once from the Colts, La Grande won twice.

The line-up has not been announced yet but after that 11-inning contest with Baker Sunday, which the Pirates won, the strength of the local team is no longer conjecture—but a proven fact.

PRESENT TENNIS CHAMPION NOW IN TOURNEY FINALS

Play in the Y. M. C. A. tennis tournament is progressing slowly but steadily. In the senior singles tournament for the championship of Eastern Oregon Floyd Smith and Ray Lynch both forfeited thereby automatically advancing Norman Freese, the present champion to the semifinals. Jean Taylor defeated Frank Black 7-5, 3-6, 6-2, thereby also advancing to the semifinals; Leo Wilson defeated Sam Cochran 6-2, 6-1, and Charles Blinzer and Waldo Stoddard each have a bid in their match to determine who shall meet Wilson in the other semi-final, Blinzer winning the first 5-7, and Stoddard the second 6-1. Stoddard previously defeated Gavin Johnson of Imbler 6-2, 6-2.

In the doubles only one match has been played in which Frank Black and Park Taylor lost to Leo Wilson of Imbler and Fred Fox of Union 6-3, 6-2.

In the Junior tournament only two matches have been played recently, these being in the doubles tournament. Casey and Merrill won from McKinnon and Thurston 6-3, 6-2, and then lost to Cochran and Larison, 6-1, 6-2.

Smith Leads in Match. INWOOD, N. Y., July 12.—MacDonald Smith, brew Scot of San Francisco, whose great comeback to golfing fame in the British open championship at Troon last month when he finished within two strokes of the title winner, gave him a place among the world stars, led the third day qualifying field for the American open championship over the Inwood country club links Wednesday with a card of 150.

With Walter Hagen, the American expert, as a partner, Smith played a brilliant game all around the 36 holes. Hagen, a little off his game, took 79 in the morning but he negotiated the first nine of the afternoon round in 36, one under par. Twenty of the 92 who started scored 159 or better, enough to qualify them. Only one amateur of the six in the field qualified. He was Frank Dyer of Upper Montclair, N. J., Metropolitan and New Jersey state champion. Perfect golfing weather favored the third day field.
