

Memoirs of Pioneers of Union County

These memoirs are written by C. D. Huffman, historian of Union County Pioneer Association. He would be pleased to hear from any one having data concerning lives of pioneers.

Thomas Carleton said "A true delineation of any man and his scene of pilgrimage through life is capable of interesting the greatest man. All men are brothers, each man's life a strange problem with every other man's, and human portraits faithfully drawn are of all pictures the welcome of human walls."

On arriving at Boise City, many yet had measles, and to add to their distress they took scurvy and were about out of food. It was necessary to force them to rest for a while in order to recuperate.

On August 11, 1862 they arrived at the Grande Ronde Valley and were glad to stop. Here Mr. Perrin got work at \$15.00 a month, for which one could buy a barrel of flour.

In July, 1877, Mr. Perrin was married to Miss Lucinda E. May and they settled on the farm where they eventually accomplished enough to keep them in the decline of life in ease and comfort. To them were born three children—Lou, born April 20, 1878, married to George Conner November 1, 1899. To this union was born one daughter, Clara, October 1, 1902. Lou died November 21, 1905, leaving Clara who has lived with her grandparents ever since, and is now a charming young lady of 20 summers still on the farm, and can do farm as well as housework, can handle a team and farming tools with the skill of an artist. In her home work she is not only expert in the ordinary art but in fancy work such as tatting, crochet and quilting. David L., born March 27, 1880 and Charles E., born January 15, 1882, keeping bachelor's hall and farming the Perrin farm on shares. Among the relics on the farm is a skillet which has been in the family over 100 years.

Mr. Perrin's Father and Mother. Mr. Perrin's father Leonard Perrin, was born April 6, 1820 in Vermont, and died in 1883 in Iowa. His mother, Catherine Maggard, was born December 24, 1818 in Virginia and died March 17, 1891 in Oregon.

They were married 1836 in Iowa. To this union were born five boys and two girls. All came west at the time, or shortly after, the family came. Max, Perrin, married a second husband, Abram Randall, on January 1861, in Iowa. Coming to Union county in 1862 where she lived until her death in 1891.

Mrs. Perrin's Parents. David B. May was married to Mary E. Logue, October 13, 1863 in the state of Indiana. On May 5, 1883, David B. May and wife Mary E. May, and five children namely, Minerva, 13, Mary, 16, George, 12, Benjamin, 7, Lucinda E., 5; also two married daughters, Elmita Thoroughs and Amanda Lloyd, with their husbands.

David B. May was born May 12, 1815 in Kentucky on what was then called the hanging fork of Dix River. He was German and Scotch descent. Mary Logue May was born July 9, 1818 in North Carolina near Rockingham. She was Irish-Welsh descent.
