Income Tax Appealed. SALEM, Ore., July 21.—Appeal to the state supreme court was perfected today by the secretary of state in the case brought by W. Lair Thompson, Portland attorney, to restrain the official from placing on the ballot at the special election, November 8, the state income tax referendum measure sponsored by the State Income Tax Referendum league.

The suit was instituted in the circuit court for Marion county and arguments of attorneys were heard by Judge G. G. Dingham, in his decision, overruled a demurrer to the plaintiff's complaint and passed the case up to the supreme court for final determination.

Eugene Girl Injured. EUGENE, Ore., July 21.—Miss Janet Prasher, 22, daughter of Mrs. E. J. Prasher of this city and a former student of the University of Oregon, sustained injuries when an automobile in which she was riding and which was driven by Mrs. M. S. Ady, Eugene police matron, struck an electric light pole in the eastern end of the city, this morning. Miss Prasher was thrown against the windshield of the car which broke, severed her jugular vein and cut deep gashes in her scalp. Although suffering from a great loss of blood she has a chance to recover, according to the attending physicians.

The physicians declared that soon after the accident occurred was prevented when Mrs. P. W. Gilstrap, an occupant of the car, grasped Miss Prasher's neck and checked the flow of blood. Other members of the party who were on their way up the river for a picnic were, Mrs. Prasher, the girls mother, and Mrs. Martin Svarcerud. Mrs. Ady, the driver of the car, is prostrated.

Suit is Thrown Out. ASTORIA, Ore., July 21.—The suit in the circuit court of Washington county by Fred C. Feldschau against Clatsop county has been thrown out of court by Judge Bagley of Hillsboro, who sustained the defendant's demurrer to the complaint. Word to that effect was received here today by G. C. and A. C. Fulton, who represented the county. The action was brought to recover damages in connection with the plaintiff's contract with the county to grade the Lewin and Clark highways.

The matter has been in controversy for several years. The original suit was filed in the circuit court of the county, but was later transferred to Washington county, as no taxpayer in Clatsop county would be eligible to serve as a juror.
