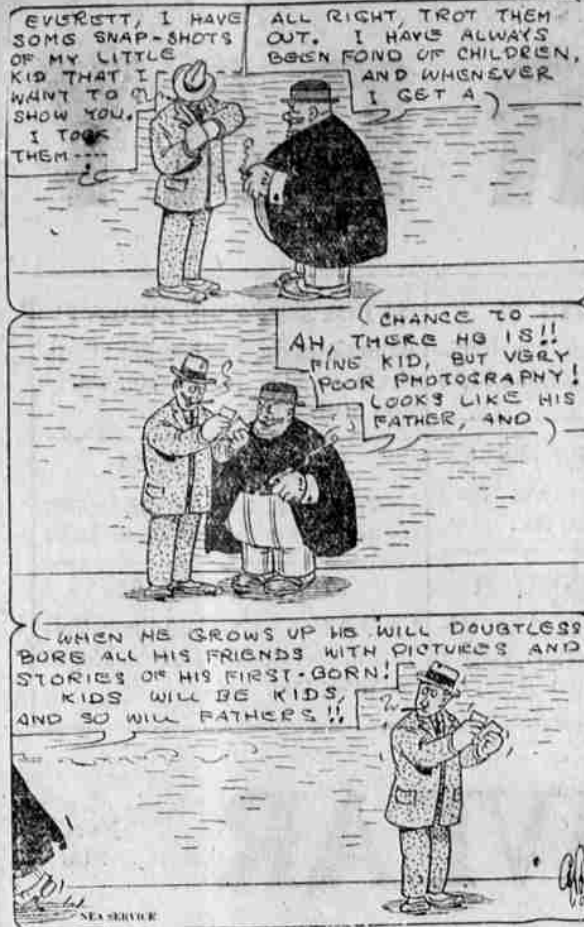

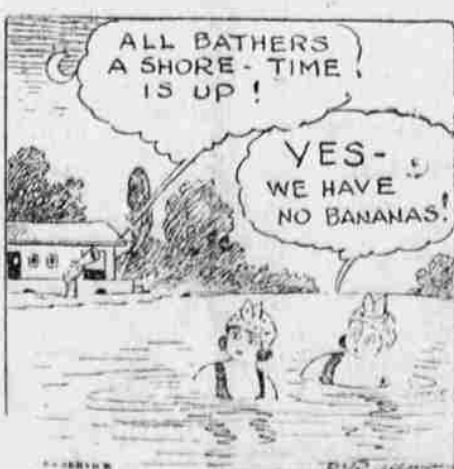

Put this all back in the cabbage, and cover with the large leaves, put into small bread-pan and bake for two hours, put just enough water in to keep the pan from burning; don't taste.
