La Grande Shipping Many Cherries East This Week

(Continued from page 1) a week or ten days ago. Even at that the crop is resulting in a big yield. Approximately \$10,000 worth of Royal Annes have been shipped from La Grande and the other types will run from \$10,000 to \$12,000.

The finished product, after leaving the packing shed, is well worth inspection. The cherries are packed in the most improved manner, each separate cherry being packed individually in layers separated by paper which insures longer lasting qualities in regard to shipping distances.

G. M. Blakely, of the Associated Fruit company of Payette, Idaho drove to La Grande today in company with S. E. Gram, district horticulturist of the Ontario, Oregon sector. W. A. Waininger and Ward Hume, all prune growers in the Boise valley, Gram inspected the cherries and, commenting to a reporter of the Observer, said: "They are packed very good—some of the best work I have seen."

Big Prune Crop Expected. In speaking of the prune outlook in Boise valley they stated that a record crop was anticipated. "We wouldn't be able to do much without irrigation," they reported, "but as it is we look for a bumper crop of prunes, to be ready for harvesting about the first of September."

Not only is the Lamb Fruit company headquarters humming with activity but other packing and shipping concerns are likewise busy this week doing their utmost to handle the cherry crop.

(Continued from page 1) sons for so-called over-production and low prices. He said that the high rates restricted wider markets for many farm products and confined growers to a narrow market circle.

"But this matter does not come within the scope of our state market law," he said, "but must be taken up with the people generally. If the farmers had 90% of its representatives in congress either the guarantee law would be extended or repealed."

The market agent compared California and Oregon in co-operative organization, and showed that the work here would be much harder than in the southern state, from the fact that in California the different products were confined to localities and easy to control, while in Oregon there was such a diversity of products on every farm that a farmer would have to be a member of a half dozen or more associations to cover his products.

Salmon Catch to Be Good. ST. HELENS, Or., July 24.—Although the run of salmon has slackened during the past few days, the season's catch will be good, and E. I. Ballagh, buyer for an Astoria cannery, estimated that 200 tons of fish will be delivered here before the season is over.

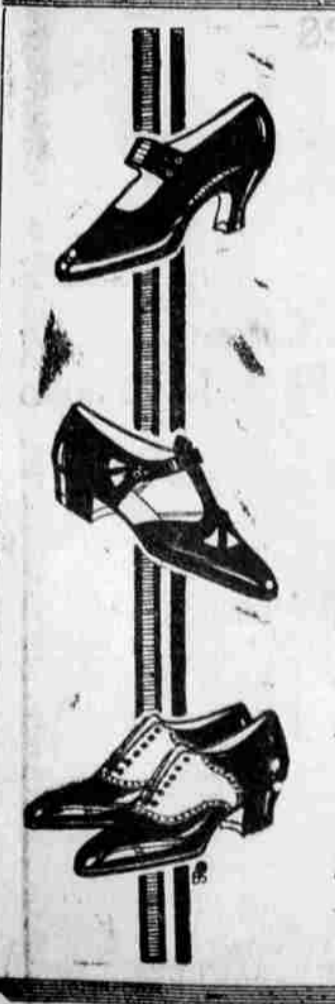
