According to members of the local Ku Klux Klan the open air initiation will be given tomorrow evening in La Grande for the purpose of initiating a class into the order, and for the further purpose of letting the public know the meaning of the Klan and its work.

A space will be roped off sufficiently large to accommodate the initiation and the public will be permitted to hear the obligations and see the actions of officers as they follow the ritualistic initiation.

The Ku Klux Klan is a secret order and this is the first large demonstration it has held in the open air in La Grande, although in Portland and other points in the state there have been a number of such initiations.

The city commissioners of La Grande have been advised that the parade to be held tomorrow evening will be held in full regalia of the K. K. K. order.
