Japan's Silk Exports Decrease.
(By the Associated Press)
TOKYO, July 23.—There has been a marked decrease this year in the export of raw silk to America, according to a report of the Board of Agriculture, to increased import duties imposed by America and the appreciation of quotations on the Yokohama market.

There also has been a falling off in the exports to England, owing to the depression in the re-export trade of British silk manufacturers. The same is true of the exports of silk to Australia and the South Sea Islands but there has been an improvement in the Indian trade, recovery in the exchange market helping the business there.
