Opera waits for home recognition

CHICAGO, July 25.—American artists and opera must be encouraged if more production is expected, and one of the best means of such encouragement is an immediate change of system in companies incorporated in the United States said Mrs. Eleanor Everett Freer, national co-chairman of the opera department, National Federation of Music Clubs, in a statement here today.

"The adoption of our own language for foreign operas will place American operas on an equal footing with those of the old world, and also will encourage a closer study of our own production," Mrs. Freer asserted. "America has opera and music all its own, but Americans have not yet fully realized it.

"Opera indigenous to our soil, in their subjects, are of great importance, although no one advocates their relative performance. The choice of the subject, however, should be entirely a personal matter with the composer. If we do not encourage our artists we cannot expect much production, and we cannot afford not to leave art treasures behind us for coming generations."

More than 80 operas by some of the best musicians in the country have been published, Mrs. Freer added, "and we as Americans should insist that they be presented along with the time-honored classics."

Pined for killing pheasants

PENDLETON, July 25.—Killing half-grown pheasants for gun practice and leaving the birds to rot on the ground was the offense which brought Ralph Jones and Richard Carano before Justice Stavers of Pilot Rock today.

Jones was fined \$50 and costs and Carano \$25 and costs. The arrests were made by W. H. Albee, game warden. He states that the two men merely used the birds as targets and apparently were not interested enough in the pheasant to pick them up after shooting them. The culprits were taken to Pilot Rock because Justice Joe H. Parkes of this city is out of town.

SAILS PACIFIC ALONE IN YAWL

(By Associated Press)
LOS ANGELES, Calif., July 25.—Harry Pidgeon, 56-year-old mariner, who sailed alone from Los Angeles harbor eighteen months ago for the Marquesas Islands in a thirty-six foot yawl, has decided to extend his trip to a voyage around the world, a 23,000-mile voyage, according to a letter received from him at the New Hebrides. Since he visited the Marquesas Islands twelve months ago, Pidgeon has called at Tahiti, Society Islands, Samoa, Fiji Islands, and the New Hebrides.

Pidgeon is now on the way to Australia and New Zealand. From there he plans to sail to the East Indies, China and Japan, thence south and westward to the east coast of Africa, from the Cape of Good Hope he plans to attempt the dangerous direct route to Cape Horn and then up the west coast of South America, he says.

In the letter Pidgeon describes the hardships he went through in his lone voyage in the small craft he built here. The letter tells of numerous battles with the elements, of careful measures taken to obtain food and water, of dangers met in fever-infested villages and of the savages with whom he made acquaintance.

Fiji Islanders, said to be the most feared cannibals of the south seas, proved friendly to Pidgeon, whose previous opinion of the Fijians, obtained from reading news of the South Seas, materially improved.

Pidgeon, who learned navigation by reading books on the subject, first attracted attention several years ago by announcing he would attempt to sail to Honolulu in a small craft without a companion. Many persons laughed at him and others begged him not to attempt the trip. However, he set sail and in a few weeks word was received that he had safely landed.
