Yanks Well Along Road To Pennant

NEW YORK, July 27.—Tris Speaker, veteran manager of the Cleveland Indians, said a bathtub when, in an interview, he declared: "The Athletics are a strong club, but the team that wins the American League pennant will have to beat the New York Yanks to do it."

From the present outlook, with Huggins' horse riding on the wings of a lead such as few teams ever have enjoyed and with the team crippled at that—other seven aggressive contenders the American circuit won't have a chance to be at the top when the season ends.

When Speaker made his statement he refrained from commenting on his team's chances. While admitting the class of the Yanks and the strength of the Athletics, he didn't breathe his own mind when he said: "I think my team is as good as any in the league."

Now his club stands second, but is far behind the Yanks. The Athletics are third. A comparison now proves Tris an optimist, but not a flatterer.

"To get an idea of the Yank strength for this article is intended to convey the impression that there is one team well nigh unbeatable when it comes to a question of running off with the prize in the American League—consider this record for games won and lost up to and including July 9:

- New York beat Boston 9 out of 14.
- New York beat St. Louis 10 out of 22.
- New York beat Detroit 5 out of 8.
- New York beat Chicago 4 out of 8.
- New York beat Philadelphia 6 out of 10.
- New York beat Cleveland 2 out of 6.

You have there a comprehensive story—one that shows what easy pickings the second division crews have been and what an elite the Yanks have had on the first division bunch. And if you follow out the statistics for games won and lost by all teams in the league you will learn that those trailing the Yanks have had a tough time of it against the tail-enders. The Athletics, to cite an instance, have won only five out of fifteen games from the Boston Red Sox, the cellar champions. Other comparisons while

similar difficulties encountered by Cleveland and Chicago. It all goes to substantiate Tris Speaker's statement. From indications at this mid-season period he might with perfect safety have gone a bit further and predicted the Yanks would win the bunting. Unquestionably they look "the class"—overs bit of it.

GOOD TIME MADE AT HORSE RACES

BAKER, July 27.—Redsell Brothers and Jim Blanton's string divided honors in the running races at Pullman park yesterday afternoon, both strings capturing two firsts. Good time was made on the soft dirt track by all entries, and some real fast racing was witnessed by the enthusiastic crowd.

The first race, a quarter of a mile, was won by Frank Hulery, owned by J. Blanton, and ridden by Smith. Handicapped, belonging to Olin Brown, was ridden by Ralph Bory, second, and Duffey, Redsell brothers, ridden by Miss Bobby Burke was the third. Time, 25 seconds.

The three-eighths mile followed with Trovbridge's mare, Lucretia, ridden by Smith, first; Redsell's Bacon, ridden by Rawls, second; and Freeman's Nuisance, ridden by Dory, third. Time 37 1/2 seconds.

In the second three-eighths mile dash Miss Hulery, ridden by Miss Burke and owned by Redsell brothers was first; Tom Hulery, owned by Jim Blanton and ridden by Smith second, and Ubell, owned by Seelman and ridden by Dory, third. Time 37 3/5 seconds.

Miss Burke, mounted on Juanita, Redsell brothers' fast mare, won her second first place of the day in the first half mile race. Snow Mountain, ridden by Smith and owned by Trovbridge was second and H. W.

H. Smith's horse, Albert, ridden by Smith was third. Time 51 2-5 seconds.

In the last half mile dash Jean Dillard, ridden by Smith and owned by Jim Blanton was first; Wm. McPherson's horse, Tom Moore, ridden by Dory, second, and Redsell brothers' mare, Mona, ridden by Rawls, third. Time 52 seconds.

H. W. P. Smith, driving his own four horse team, won the chariot race making the half mile in 1 minute and seven seconds. Some good races are scheduled to come off this afternoon and a larger crowd of spectators is expected to be present.

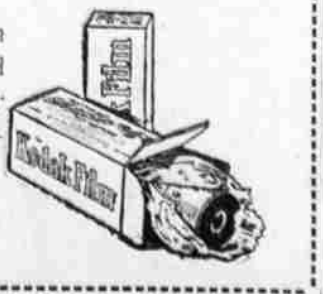
