Playing today at the Sherry Theatre is "The Blood Test," a western picture of the great outdoors in which Dick Hutton is starred. For a western drama this production contains probably the strongest and most adequate cast ever offered. The utmost is attained by each of Hutton's supporters, who it is evident placed their best efforts in their work.

Throughout this picture, there is that tendency which causes one unconsciously to grip the arm of the chair and breathe about ten beats faster. There is never one minute when the action lags, and as for coherence, both the story and continuity are as smooth as ribbon and the tenor throughout is held at approximately uniform pitch. "The Blood Test" is a western production of a higher plane. It is a real, human story of real people who do natural things and it contains those most vital elements, drama, punch and suspense, equally distributed in plentiful supply.

Hutton performs no doubt the best work of his career in this production. He is highly pleasing and is the possessor of one of the most magnetic personalities on the screen today. In the role of Dick Gentry, he plays quietly and cautiously until the latter part of the picture when, letting way to the full swing of his ability, he becomes nearly dynamic. 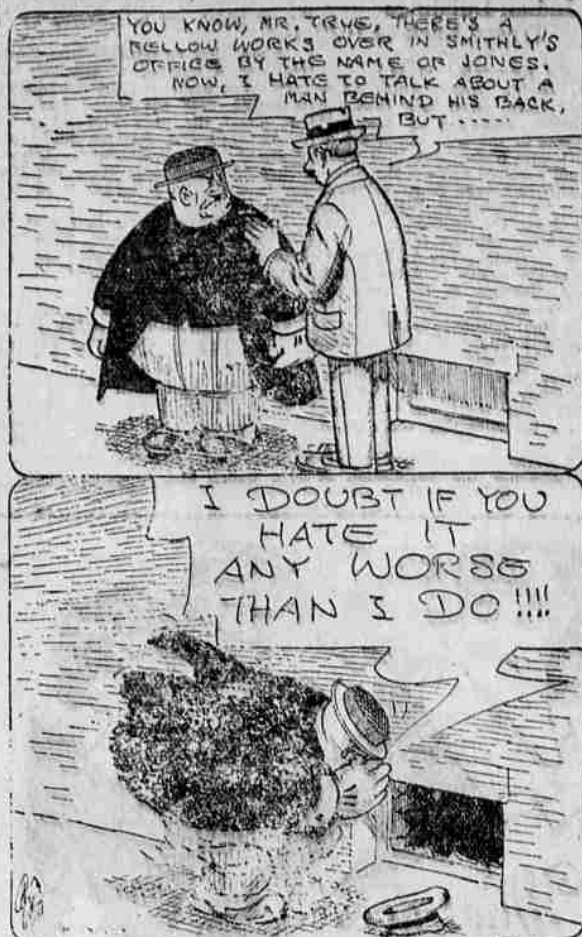

PENDLETON, Ore., July 27.—The draw south of the Cold Springs reservoir has been designated as land inside the "deadline" for goose hunters during the season, according to a ruling received by the Pendleton Rod and Gun club from department of agriculture officials. Heretofore the hunters have been compelled to hunt from a position so far from the hunting grounds that the geese, in going to their feeding places, have been out of range. A petition was sent to the department last fall asking for the change of ruling.

PENDLETON, Ore., July 27.—A petition asking the state highway commission to change the name of Cabbage Hill on all the state maps and records has been circulated in this county by members of the Pioneer club, a women's organization. The petition will be presented to the commission at its meeting in Portland July 30. The new name of the picturesque heights already has been approved by the Old Oregon Trail association and the Pendleton Commercial association.

Rattlesnakes Are Plentiful.

HOOD RIVER, Ore., July 28.—Recent warm weather is bringing out the rattlesnakes, denizens of the country between here and The Dalles on the Columbia River gorge. Traffic Officer Harry Wood yesterday killed a snake with seven rattles and a button, just this side of Mosier. State Game Officer Salzman says he has found several bodies at dead rattlers, minus their warning caudal appendages, along the road.
