### Real Estate Boom Hits Japan Summer Resorts

TOKIO, July 21. (A.P.)—The demand for homes at the various seaside and mountain resorts of Japan made famous by foreigners is over on the increase, and those foreigners who invested wisely are reaping their harvest. Prices have gone up but sold within the last few years and there seems no tendency to fall. At Kuruzawa, the mountain resort to which missionaries from all over the Far East flock in summer, and where the Prince Regent will spend part of this season, very high prices are being paid for houses and land. The same is true at Kamakura, Mushi, and Hayama, the seaside resorts, formerly almost entirely foreign, which have been invaded by the Japanese.

The property which foreigners are selling is held by them on 999-year leases, or through virtue of their being members of Japanese land companies such as were organized by the alienated missionary bodies.

## MAY HAVE FOUND MOTHER LODE

Vaie Enterprise Thinks Malheur's Rich Mining Days Are to Return.

Has the famed "mother lode" of the Malheur City mines been found at last?

In the pure fabulous rich district of the early days to come back into fame and wealth again?

These are those in Malheur City who never see to both questions and have their hearts set on the rich quartz lode made a few days ago in the old Red, White and Blue mines.

The discovery was made by men who are working the Malheur mine under a lease. The quartz is immensely rich, running \$15,000 to the ton in gold. They have not gone in far enough to tell definitely whether it is a vein or simply a "lode," but every indication so far points to the prevalent belief that they have struck the long-lost lode of quartz vein or mother lode of the Malheur district.

In the early sixties placer mining was at its height in this district and millions of dollars in placer gold was washed from the hills, the prospectors having always held to the belief that a mother lode was hidden somewhere in this district.

They have always been seeking this vein. Subsequently developments in the Red, White and Blue mine will disclose whether it has been found or not.

"We believe that the Malheur mines are going to come back into their own-time fame," and that Malheur City will be one of the boom towns of Oregon within a short time," said W. N. Wardman.

## MORE INTEREST IN LUMBER

Further trade conditions continue to improve, says the American Lumbermen's League. Demand is growing slowly but steadily and, while prices have shown no material change and in some cases are still fluctuating by a cent, the general tendency seems to be upward.

Retailers have worked their stocks to bedrock and continue to produce a brisk business supplying contractors especially for the buildings of small homes. The result is that they are coming more and more often into the market, but still largely for immediate requirements, and that they must soon divert from this policy and begin buying ahead if they expect to meet the prospective heavy fall demand.

Wholesalers foresee an early big development in demand and a rise in prices, and many of them are coming into the market for speculative purposes. It is noticeable, however, that the mills are unwilling to accept the low prices offered, but prefer to hold what regular business comes in and to use their surplus production toward building up their stocks.

Speculators in both city and country are showing real interest in the market, and inquiries are plentiful. Some are already placing sizable orders covering fall needs, feeling that early action will be easy, but it is difficult to secure deliveries later on. Car loads are scarce what will happen. Much depends on whether farmers decide to market their crop immediately, or to hold a good part of them in hopes of subsequent price improvement. In the former case a acute car shortage appears inevitable, while in the latter no serious trouble is likely to develop.

Lumber production is increasing, following the earlier shutdown early in the month, and while mill stocks of soft woods are still broken there should be no difficulty in meeting fall demands. Hardwood supplies are scarce, due to the very heavy buying and winter and spring which reduced stocks in merchantable quantities, and to the subsequent stoppage of production by exceptionally heavy rains.

## UTAH MARKETS BIG WOOL CLIP

(By Associated Press)

SAULT LAKE, July 31.—Utah's 1923 wool crop, aggregating 3,600,000 pounds more than was estimated, at the first of the year, valued at approximately \$3,000,000, is now on the market and the lambs are being started toward the packing house centers.

James A. Hooper, secretary of the Utah State Woolgrowers' association, states that the season's output would reach 13,000,000 pounds, exceeding the earlier estimates by 2,000,000 pounds.

Prices this year are a little higher than those of last year and the tonnage also shows a slight increase.

Conditions this year are generally

better than those of last year, and Utah, compared with Wyoming, Idaho and Montana, has experienced a better season in the sheep and wool business.
