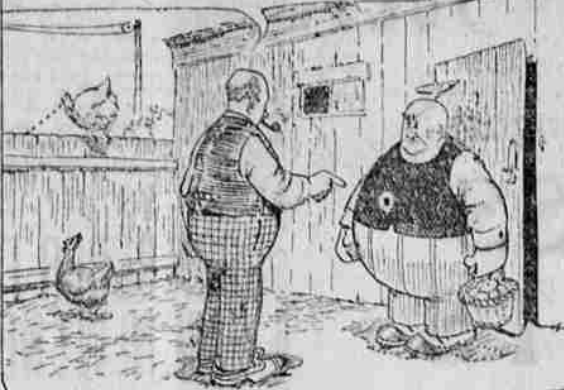

Scientists Seek Means To Increase Cotton Crop
EUGENE, Ore., July 31.—Leading scientists of Australia, Japan, China, Siberia, India, Burma, Netherlands, Canada, and the United States will attend the second Pan-Pacific Scientific Congress at Sydney and Melbourne, Australia, from August 13 to September 3, according to Dr. Warren D. Smith, head of the University of Oregon department of geology. Dr. Smith will attend the international meet, which will be held under the direction of the Australian Research Council, and will include addresses in all fields of science.

Dr. Smith, who for more than ten years was chief of the division of mines of the bureau of science of the Philippines, will speak on "Structure of the Philippines," and "Status of Geological Surveys in the Philippines."

The scientific congress is part of a general program of welding together the peoples of the Pacific, and the meeting is expected to aid in the movement for international peace.

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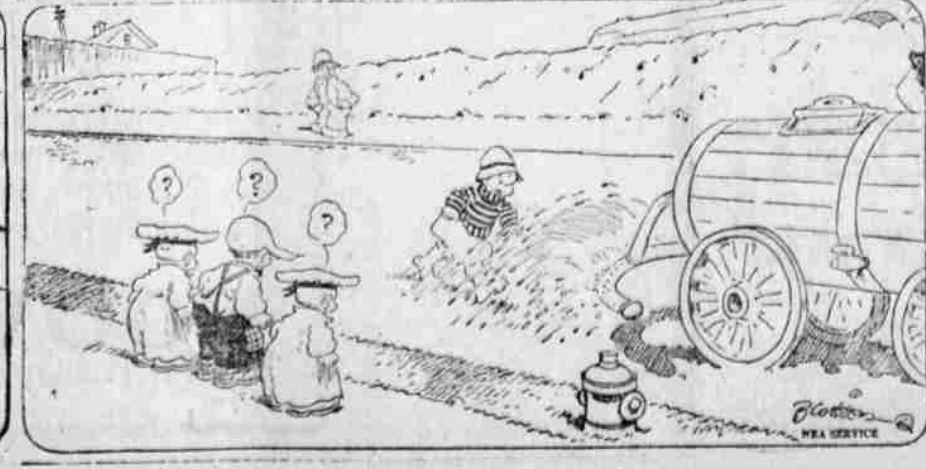
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With Fresh or Canned Fish
