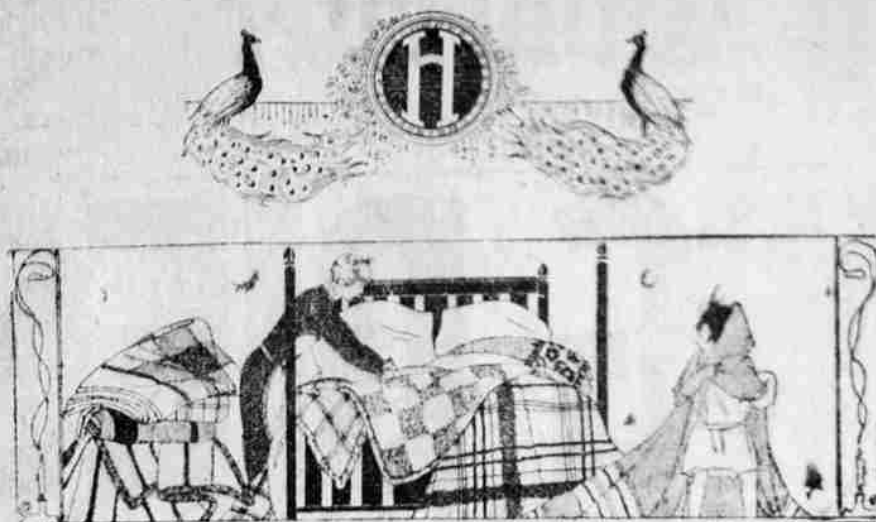

CHRISTIANITY ONLY THING TO SAVE WORLD

Far East Representative
Addressing Churchmen
at National Capital Today

WASHINGTON, August 3.—The
only solution of international
as well as national problems in the
Far East lies in following Christian prin-
ciples. The spirit of Jesus must
rule.

To a body of churchmen today the
Rev. Dr. Sidney L. Gulick, secretary
of the Commission on International
Justice and Goodwill of the Federal
Council of Churches, a noted author-
ity on the Far East who has just
returned from nearly a year in the
north and south of China, in Korea,
in Japan and in the Philippines, made
this report. He declared that the
questions vexing the United States
and Japan can be solved only along
the same lines.

The anti-Christian movement
which reached its height a little more
than a year ago has died down," he
said. "Christian missions are exer-
cising great influence in the national
life of both China and Japan. It is
this lies the hope of the situation.
The problems of China will gradu-
ally be solved as the young men who
have been trained in Western coun-
tries and in the mission schools
gradually take charge of affairs."

In Japan Dr. Gulick received a
warm welcome. Union meetings of Chris-
tians were held in 35 cities. He was
given 38 luncheons or banquets by
churches, chambers of commerce,
business men and foreign residents.
These dinners were in the larger
cities like Yokohama, Kyoto, Osaka
and Kobe, and upon the night be-
fore he left Japan he was given a
big dinner in Tokyo by the Japan-
American Relations Committee, at
which Viscount Shibusawa presided.

NEW LIBRARIAN TAKES POSITION

Miss Mabel E. Doty Fills
Place Made Vacant by
the Resignation of Mrs.
Bowser.

Edith Pickett Bowser, librarian for
the last two years, has resigned her
position and Miss Mabel T. Doty of
Los Angeles began her new duties
on August 1st. The new librarian
will be very glad to meet the library
patrons and readers, then any ser-
vice possible, she announced today.

Seven new drop lights have been
added in the reading rooms which
greatly improves the lighting facili-

ties and affords great satisfaction
to the evening readers in the library.
The circulation for July still main-
tained its high average, 409 more
books being circulated than during
July of last year when the County
Library was in existence.

The total number of books and
periodicals was 3,233. Of this num-
ber, 906 circulated were juvenile
and 2,327 adult. The average cir-
culation was 134. New borrowers
for the month were 38 and of this
number 17 were juvenile. Books
borrowed from the State Library
amounted to 19 volumes.

Vacation days are busy days, says
Miss Doty, and just the time for
browsing among the books in the
Public Library. If you are not a
borrower why not become one and
carry one home some books from a
few of our interesting collections.
If you have not been able to make
