SHERRYS LAST DAY. "THE 2nd FIDDLE"

If you want to renew your youth, or if you are young and want to see a realistic story of human life unfolded before your eyes, then you will receive the full measure of your desire in "Second Fiddle."

This is a gripping and entertaining drama of intense human interest. It deals with that age-old problem, the eternal triangle, in the persons of two young men and a girl. The story is by Frank Tuttle and was directed under his personal supervision, which is a guarantee in itself of its excellence.

FOR THE NOONDAY LUNCH
Eggs and Green Peas

- 1 slice bread, 3 inches thick
- 6 hard cooked eggs
- 1 cup cooked green peas
- 4 tbsp. butter
- 4 tbsp. flour
- 2 cups milk
- 1/2 lemon
- Salt and pepper

Scoop out the inside of this large slice of bread so as to leave a case. Scatch the top and fry golden brown in hot fat. Make a sauce by melting half the butter in pan, stir in flour, add milk and salt, pepper and lemon juice. Lay in slices of hard boiled eggs until they are heated. Now heat the peas and add butter and seasoning. Put a layer of peas in bottom of bread case and fill up with eggs and sauce. Arrange border of peas around top.
