Barthelme Gives Screen His Greatest Photodrama in "Fury"

Perhaps no word in the dictionary has been quite so overworked, misused and abused as "Great." It is a word that has been applied indiscriminately to many motion pictures. Once in a great while—and in this instance it is very properly applied—a photoplay justly deserves the appellation. Such a motion picture was "Fury." Now comes "Fury" and "Barthelme" in another which impels us to go one step further in superlatives and say "Greater," if not "Greatest."

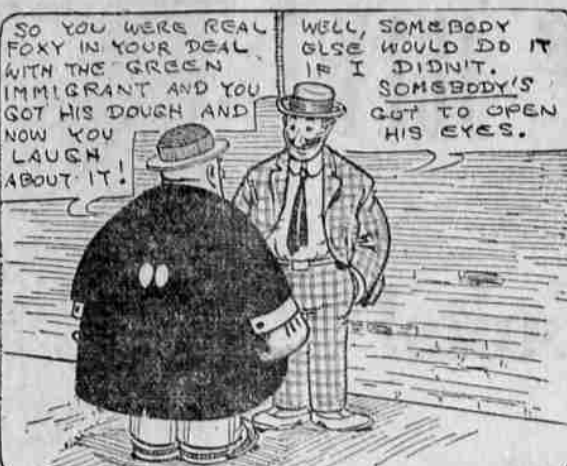
That motion picture is "Fury," the first National attraction which is being shown at the Star Theatre today and Friday only. Replete with human interest, stirring with action, flavored with a heart touch that in one moment draws a tear and the next a laugh, this production, filmed under the direction of Henry King, is a chapter out of life itself—life of the bounding main to Limehouse, London, and Glasgow, Scotland.

In this screen story by Edmund Goulding one sees Richard Barthelme as "Boy" Leyton, the blind second mate of the "Lady Sissy," whose rough old father, the captain, hates him for his disability. The whole nature of "Boy" undergoes a sudden change, however, when old "Dog" Leyton, learning of his son's contemplated elopement with a Limehouse boarding house slave, casts aspersions upon Minnie. The enraged old springs at his father and the captain, overjoyed at his son's display of courage, seizes him to his breast. Captain Leyton suffers a heart stroke and, dying, exacts a promise from "Boy" to avenge his mother, who has been mistreated by the man she had run away with. This must be done before he marries Minnie. Though the news breaks the heart of the girl, "Boy" is determined to carry out his father's wish. He finds his mother in Scotland, then at sea comes the gripping climax with "Boy" and the man. The story has a novel twist that brings it to the happiest of conclusions.

Dorothy Gish gives one of her most appealing characterizations as Minnie, while Tyrone Power is splendid and convincing as Captain Leyton. Other whose artistry contributes to the high caliber of this production are Pat Hartigan, Barry Macollum and Jessie Arnold.

The sea "shots" on the "Lady Sissy" are the last word in striking main photography and constitute some of the best features of this truly great motion picture.

Bread Dishes for Meatless Days

Scientists and dieticians tell us bread is an excellent substitute for meat. The following fish and bread combinations offer opportunities that will relieve the monotony of the menu on Friday and other meatless days.

SALMON LOAF
Blend together one can of salmon, one cup of grated bread crumbs, two beaten eggs, one cup of milk, one teaspoon of lemon juice, one-fourth teaspoon of paprika, one-half teaspoon of salt, one tablespoon of chopped parsley and one tablespoon of onion juice. Place in a greased baking dish. Sprinkle top with thin layer of bread crumbs. Bake in hot oven for thirty minutes or until the crumbs that cover the dish are browned.
