OLD ORDER OF HONOR REVIVED

PARIS, July 18.—(By Mail.)—Paris has taken one more step back to pre-war conditions by reviving duelling. Two barristers who insisted on settling a personal difference with duelling swords revived a procedure which, since the war, has appeared ridiculous even in the eyes of the French, who still maintain that there are some disputes that can only be decided "on the field of honor."
 General opinion, however, is still against duelling for anything short of the gravest reasons, and one writer regretting its revival has suggested that a new code should prescribe that encounters can only take place in the devastated regions, close to a battlefield or in a military cemetery. "Few are the adventures," he says, "who facing wooden crosses of so many Frenchmen, killed in the most formidable duel in history, will not find their own quarrel ludicrous and fall in each other's arms."

Waves of Japanese Invasion
 SYDNEY, N. S. W., Aug. 6.—William M. Hughes, until recently premier of Australia, believes that some day the surplus population of Japan may come knocking at the doors of Australia, seeking relief from the starvation that has compelled them to flee from their overcrowded island empire. And, if this does happen, Australia can hardly bid them to go if she still lacks people.
 He held Mr. Hughes' opinion in an article in the Sydney Telegraph. It believes Australia today is probably her efforts to fill her vacant spaces with men and women of the white race.

TECH SCHOOLS NOT SO POPULAR

NEW YORK, Aug. 6.—The late world war, almost exclusively a conflict of science and engineering, gave a tremendous impetus to public interest in engineering study and resulted in a big increase of enrollments in the technical departments of American colleges, according to statistics just gathered for Mechanical Engineering, official journal of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers.
 "Never in the history of the world," says that publication, "were engineers of greater importance and in greater demand than during the period from 1915 to 1920. The 1920 enrollment was nearly 50 percent greater than that of 1912 and 1914."
 Figures assembled by Allen Bright, registrar, and W. F. Rittman, professor of mechanical engineering, both universities and institutes.

LONDON STARTS TRADE CAMPAIGN

LONDON, July 18.—(By Mail.)—Two-thirds of the boys reared in London enter casual trades, as unskilled labor and shopmen, and only 13 percent of them enter the skilled trades. These figures, which have been prepared in interest of a campaign to furnish greater technical education for London's youth, are said to be higher in unskilled and lower in skilled trades than any other large city in western Europe or America.
 The result of insufficient technical training centers, and the poverty among the lower classes, which forces the boys to work at very early ages.
 The campaign which is being backed by many welfare organizations will attempt to arouse interest in the establishing of training centers throughout England.
