The strength of Douglas fir and badly assorted, and increasing demand is illustrated by the fact that book prices during the latter part of July in the northwest reached 105 per cent of normal. Speculative trade is again cropping up, showing the turn in sentiment, higher. A notable increase in demand and large orders at the previous low has also occurred in the hardwood market.

Most of the current demand for softwoods comes from retailers, who are keenly interested themselves in the market in view of their low and broken stocks, and of the outlook for a prosperous business this fall. Not much forward buying is yet being done, but that stage of market development is now being rapidly approached. The recent softness of prices has been largely responsible for the postponement in making necessary replenishments, but now that prices are steady and beginning to show an upward tendency, dealers are realizing that no purpose will be served by further delaying commitments, but that delay might prove a costly experience, because mill stocks in nearly all producing territories are still low a year ago.

# ADAPT VEHICLES TO THE ROADS

STOCKHOLM, July 17.—(By Mail) Sweden, considering the motorizing of its highway traffic, declares that the general establishment of regular automobile passenger and truck service cannot wait for the construction of new roads and the rebuilding of old ones, but that the motor vehicles must be adapted to the roads.

The roads are to be divided into four classes, according to the weights which they are able to sustain. Tractors, rather than additional motor trucks, are to be used wherever the traffic is heavy. A curious type of vehicle is recommended for winter use in northern Sweden. This car is

to have slash runners instead of front wheels, and will be equipped with special drive wheels and rear. For the financing of this new service, yearly subsidies have been proposed, as well as a government loan fund.
