Senator Capper Asks Lower Freight Rates on Flour and Grain (By Associated Press) TOPEKA, Kans., Aug. 7.—Refusal by rail executives in Chicago recently to accept the suggestion that railroads cut freight rates on wheat and flour for export 25 per cent as an emergency means of helping the unfavorable situation of the wheat growers, is not taken as final by United States Senator Arthur Capper. An appeal to have this emergency rate put into effect was made in letters forwarded Saturday by Senator Capper to Hale Holden, Chicago, president of the Association of Railway Executives, and Halthaser H. Myer, Washington, chairman of the interstate commerce commission. The senator's letter pointed out that the plan proposed by the chamber of commerce of Lincoln and Omaha, Neb., not only will help the farmers and business conditions generally, but will serve as "a great opportunity for the roads to make substantial gains in the good will of the public."
