The indictment sets out three alleged schemes which it says are fraudulent and which Arnold will be called upon to explain during the court hearing. He is charged with misrepresenting the value of securities offered for sale by his company, with attempting to defraud investors out of company bonds by offer of an unsecured note, and with causing the false arrest of company officials.

In December of 1921 Arnold gave the needy of Madison a Christmas dinner costing \$25,000. Thereafter he led a series of revival meetings, at which he urged a return to the teachings of the Bible. Then he and his family moved to New York where the revival meetings were continued.

"Dead Man" Gone

SALISBURY, Aug. 7.—John L. Bixby of Freewater, Or., who was driving to Salem, Friday afternoon, from Jefferson, probably came nearer to paying an official visit to the county coroner's parlors and yet escape the experience, of any person in the state. Friday afternoon a telephone call was received by the coroner that a man had just been killed in an auto accident about two miles north of Jefferson on the Pacific highway and to hurry out and take charge of the body. With all haste possible Coroner Lloyd Higdon with his assistant made a fast run in their ambulance to the scene. There they found a badly demolished automobile lying against a telephone pole. Glass was scattered about and there was every evidence that the driver of the machine had bled to death. But there was no dead man there, and furthermore, no person who could shed any light upon the mysterious disappearance of the corpse. Fearing foul play, Coroner Higdon made note of every thing visible about the wreck and loaded all articles of baggage into the ambulance and returned to the city. Shortly after arriving here they learned that the man had been taken to the Willamette Sanitarium where it was found that he was badly cut about the face and hands, but had a good chance for recovery.

When Mr. Bixby is well enough to leave the hospital he will find his baggage at the Higdon mortuary. It is expected that the whole effect will be that a little more care and less speed will be used in passing other tourists.

pretation on the provisions of the law. Thus, he ruled that in the event women entitled to the birth bounty are discharged, such discharges must be strictly bona fide and no substitutes can be put in their places. Also, if a worker decides not to return to work after giving birth to a child and receiving the proscribed bounty, she is still entitled to the month's pay and is under no obligation to return. The Attorney-General has also ruled that the provisions of the law apply to all females, whether married or unmarried.

A Filipino regiment, the 57th U. S. Infantry, stationed at Fort Mc Kinley, has just achieved the distinction of qualifying 100 per cent of its personnel as rifle shot—experts, sharpshooters and marksmen. This is a record for the United States Army, the best previous showing having been made by the 25th U. S. Infantry at Nogales, Arizona, last year with 97 per cent.

FATALITIES AT CROSSINGS MORE

(Continued From Page One.) cally unfit to drive.

The average driver, as a rule, is careful, but there are moments when even he may take a chance, unmindful of the danger, by resorting to excessive speed or failing to take the necessary precaution when going over a railroad crossing. The driver of an automobile, as well as all the rest of us, must bear in mind that a momentary lapse of vigilance may cause death.

Every railroad crossing is indicated by the crossing sign. When 1,335 feet from the crossing, the engineer blows the whistle of his engine in two long and two short blasts as a warning. This crossing signal should be heeded and a driver approaching a railroad crossing should stop, look, and listen sufficiently to satisfy himself that it is safe to go over.

Investigations of collisions between automobiles and trains invariably show that they are due to carelessness on the part of the driver, or to defects in the mechanism of his automobile. Defective brakes have resulted in autos running into the side of moving trains, causing death to the driver and the occupants of his car. The mistake of stepping on the accelerator in place of the brake occasionally brings a driver to grief. Ignorance has sent many drivers to their death at railroad crossings. Many automobiles meet with disastrous results on account of stalling on the tracks. However, speed and carelessness of the driver have caused for the greatest number of collisions. The driver when taking his car out must know that his steering and brake gear are in perfect order, as well as his engine and running gear, and he must by all means take it upon himself to be cautious on his entire trip, using the eyes, ears, and brain that God gave him.

To care when driving your car, and particularly when negotiating a railroad crossing. Heed the warning signs. Don't fail to stop, look, and listen.
