Aged Man Kills Two Women, Then Commits Suicide

BATTLE CREEK, Mich., Aug. 8. (A. P.)—The body of Mrs. B. H. Stewart, 58, was found by a posse of searchers late Tuesday 10 miles southeast of this city, bringing to three the number of persons whose deaths are blamed on John H. Wells, 70, retired merchant and reputed to be wealthy.

Wells early Tuesday shot and killed his wife, Ella, 65, and himself. He left word with a nephew that he had killed Mrs. Stewart and placed her body in a clump of bushes some distance from this city.

Jealousy is the theory advanced by police as the cause of the triple killing.

The body of Wells and his wife were found in their apartment when detectives, called by neighbors, broke down the door. Both the man and the woman had been shot through the head and a revolver was gripped in Wells' left hand.

Mr. Stewart was last seen Tuesday morning, when, according to those living near her home, she drove away in an automobile with an elderly man. Police are working on the theory that Wells drove the woman to the woods, shot and killed her and then returned, killing his wife and himself.

This theory is partially corroborated, police say, by the discovery of blood stains on the gear shift lever of Wells' automobile. Also, it is said, Wells told his nephew, Charles Kiddell, that if anyone inquired for Mrs. Stewart she could be found five miles south of the city at a little stone bridge.

Mrs. Stewart was the wife of an electrician, Bert Stewart. Wells came to Battle Creek two years ago from Oklahoma.

Prayer Is Answered

SPOKANE, Wash., Aug. 8.—Regarding a babe left on her doorstep two weeks ago as an answer to her oft-repeated prayer for a child, Mrs. Chris Miller of Spokane has asserted that she will take all possible legal means to retain the child, despite the power of juvenile authorities to take it from her.

"I have already made clothes for the baby, and I love it as my own," she pleaded. "We have the adoption petition all made out and my neighbors are all willing to sign that I am capable of giving the child a good home."

Pension Increase Asked

G. A. R. to Propose Additional Pay for Civil War Veterans.
 DES MOINES, Aug. 8. (A. P.)—A resolution proposing that congress grant a pension of \$72 a month to every living soldier, sailor and marine who served in the Union forces in the Civil war and was honorably discharged, is to be submitted to the 57th national encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic, to be held at Milwaukee beginning September 2, according to a general order issued from national headquarters here Tuesday.

Widows of such veterans would be granted a \$50 monthly pension provided they lived with their husbands during the five years prior to death. At the recommendation of the resolution are followed out. It also asks that all pensions be paid up to the day of the death of the veteran.
