FIGHT SEASON TO OPEN SEPTEMBER 3

Boxing will be revived in La Grande early in the month of September, according to an announcement made today by Gus Bairie, local pugilist, who states that he will fight Mysterious Billy Smith, of Portland, September 3 in a ten round headliner in La Grande. Complete arrangements for the staging of the card have not been made and more detailed announcements will follow in the near future.

Bairie, who has not been in the ring for several weeks, due to the summer's cessation in fight circles in Eastern Oregon, will resume training

in a few days. "I'm going to be right when I meet Mysterious Billy," Bairie said to the writer. "Joe Carr has provided me with complete training facilities and I'll be down to the grind and business of getting into the best of shape this week."

Bairie will fight at 135 as will his opponent, Mike Brotherton and a boxer from Salt Lake City will be mustered into Bairie's training camp in a short time and with two expert bat-fingers to work out with, Bairie is expecting to be in better condition than ever before when September 3 arrives.

Luis Firpo Is Again Winner

PHILADELPHIA, (A. P.)—Luis Angel Firpo, South American heavyweight, knocked out Charley Weinert of Newark, N. J., in the second round of an eight-round no-decision match Monday night in National league ball park.

Round 1—Weinert brought blood to Firpo's nose with straight lefts and the South American gave way, clinching as they fell into the ropes. Firpo landed two heavy right swings to the body and followed with right to the head and one to body without damage. They were both slightly winded when the bell rang.

Round 2—Firpo rushed wildly at Weinert and they clinched. Firpo landed right to the body. Weinert jabbed lightly. Weinert moved to the law. Firpo landed right and they clinched. Firpo appeared and staggered Weinert, knocking him down for the count of nine. Firpo ruck Weinert after he came up and landed flush on the jaw, sending him to the canvas for the full count after one minute and 49 seconds of fighting.

Rattlesnake Bite Fatal to Iowa Girl. KEOKUK, Ia., (AP)—Minnie Alberta Woodward, aged 7, living near Farmington, Iowa, died early Sunday from the effects of a rattlesnake bite.

BABE RUTH LEADS LEAGUE SWATSMEN.

CHICAGO, (AP) — Baseball's greatest home run hitter, Babe Ruth, of the New York Americans Monday leads the American league in batting by a narrow squeak in spite of his team's defeat Sunday by the Detroit Tigers, 5 to 2.

Ruth, by hammering out a homer, a double and a single, jacked up his batting average to .3994. Inasmuch as Harry Heilmann, the Detroit slugger, was out of the game with a strained tendon, Ruth took the league-batting lead away from him. Heilmann's average is .3937. Ruth's home run was his twenty-ninth of the season, putting him even with Cy Williams of the Philadelphia Nationals.

Seeks More Policewomen.

LONDON, July 24. (By Mail)—Having won her fight for the non-sale of alcohol to minors, Lady Astor is now urging the British government to appoint more women "policemen." Speaking recently in the House of Commons on the salaries of the metropolitan police force, she declared the present force of women was totally inadequate.

Viscountess Astor said more women police were needed in London for patrol duty, and she appealed to the Home Secretary to increase their number and widen their authority.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 14. (AP)—Radio and all other modern methods of communication have not succeeded in casting the carrier pigeon from its position as an important factor in the war time transmission of intelligence.

The American army maintains 1,400 birds along the Mexican border, in Hawaii, in the Canal Zone, and otherwise distributed at some 22 army posts. Fifty are fed daily in the Philippines, while at Camp Vail, New Jersey, the reserve headquarters, 400 birds draw their rations, waiting to be of service in the field in which, in the past, they have proved themselves most valuable.
