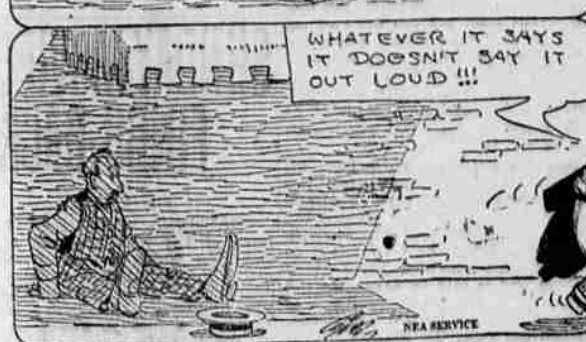

HIGHWAY TO BE READY FOR FAIR

State Engineers Declare They Will Work to Open Traffic by September 25 Between La Grande and Elgin.

ELGIN, Aug. 18.-The new highway to La Grande will be open to traffic in time for the Union County Fair if no unforeseen delays occur, according to R. H. Balcock, division engineer, and J. M. Bishop, resident engineer, who are in general charge of the work for the state.

The crusher started working the first of the week on the set below the overhead crossing and will be kept going at top speed to clear away the big rock slide. The highway out of Elgin is being graded up ready for application of rock.

The fill contractors have been making good progress and have their cut practically made and the fill far enough along to go across the new bridge to the highway. Their work should be completed by September 1.

The big rock slide where tons of rock were moved down upon the highway and into the river by a huge blast last spring blocks the highway to all traffic until it is cleared away.

If this is done first, however, as the engineers indicated, they would advise, it should be an easy matter to have access to the fair at Elgin over the new route by September 25.
