**PENDLETON TO STAGE GRAIN, HAY EXHIBIT**

Pendleton, Oregon, October 25, 26 and 27 are the dates set for the third annual Northwest Grain and Hay Show to be held in Pendleton. The dates are later than last year, when the show was held September 18 to 23.

Entries will be open to grain and hay growers of Oregon, Washington and Idaho. Each exhibitor will be allowed to make entries in as many classes as he wishes, but will not be allowed to make more than one entry in any one class.

All applications for entry must be in the hands of the Northwest Grain and Hay Show association not later than October 15. Fred Bonson, county agent and secretary of the show, will do much to gather the material for the exhibit.

No entry fee will be charged in any class. The prizes will be \$250 for wheat, \$100 for barley, \$50 for rye and \$75 for alfalfa.

All samples must have been grown by the exhibitor in the year 1923 and must be entered for the facility in which they were grown. All exhibits of alfalfa must be made in bales of standard size. All exhibits of threshed grain must consist of one bushel each. Clipped or scoured oats are objectionable for seed purposes and will be discounted by the judges accordingly. Transportation charges on all samples must be prepaid by the owner. All exhibits returned to the owner will be at his own expense. All samples of threshed grain and hay will become the property of the Northwest Grain

**TO EXPLAIN VETS BUREAU POLICIES**

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Director Frank T. Hines of the Veterans' Bureau has accepted an invitation of the American Legion to appear at the fifth annual convention of the organization to be held in San Francisco in October. The Veterans' Bureau head will go to the convention city for the express purpose of explaining to the legionnaires the attitude of the relief body towards the disabled man, because their organization represents the greatest body of U. S. World war veterans, who are today carrying on for relief of those maimed by war.

In his letter of acceptance Gen. Hines said: "I appreciate the importance to the disabled men of maintaining a close understanding between ex-service organizations and that government agency established to administer those acts of Congress which reflect the views of the people with regard to care of those who were impaired in military service. It is particularly important that the largest of these organizations have definite understanding of the policies as it is possible to give."

Director Hines is to address the general assembly of legion men, and will appear before certain committees of the organization to clarify views of the members as to future procedure of the Veterans' Bureau.

came on rapidly and drove down to the field against the wind, without circling. He made a quick and graceful landing, the wheels of his plane touching the ground less than a minute after the roar of the plane's motor was first heard.

Trucks Meet Plane. — But if he was quick, those awaiting him were quicker. The propeller of his plane had not stopped turning when a mail truck, waiting for his consignment of messages and small packages, was backed up directly to the plane and men threw the pouches from the cockpit to the truck, which sped away to the postoffice for sorting of the letters.

Half a dozen special messengers, with motorcycles, whose engines were popping, stood by for the special delivery letters which accompanied the pouches and presently dashed away to begin deliveries.

Vance, who is a slender, wiry figure of medium height, climbed out of his seat with a smile. He is a veteran air mail pilot and, except for an added effort to make speed in his flight, Wednesday's effort was nothing unusual for him.

Vance said there had been no unusual incident in connection with his flight.

"I had head winds soon after taking off from Reno," he said, "but they were not serious. I averaged about 100 miles from there to here, flying most of the time at 13,000 to 14,000 feet altitude."

Officials Pleased. — A. C. Nelson, superintendent of the western division of the air mail service, and Col. W. E. Gilmore of the air service of the Ninth corps area of the army, extended official greetings to Vance as he stepped down from his plane.

Nelson himself is a former army aviator.

The first package to come from the plane Wednesday was that which Tuesday started from New York. In it was a motion picture news reel showing the preliminaries of the start west. It was added to the New York package at Hempstead field.

Special attention was called by air officers to the rapidity with which mail was changed from one plane to another at the western fields Wednesday. Though 15 minutes were allowed for this in the official schedule, at no field was more than two required, and on the last change, that at Reno, late Wednesday afternoon, the transfer from incoming to outgoing plane was made in one minute.

Plans Meet at Omaha. — OMAHA—Jack Knight, with the second San Francisco-New York consignment of flying mail, landed at Fort McCook field at 10:20 p. m., 1 hour 25 minutes ahead of his scheduled time.

Pilot Dan Smith left with the San Francisco-New York mail just six minutes after Knight landed, 10:26 p. m.

Knight brought in 17 sacks of mail, four of which were for Omaha. Smith picked up the 13 remaining
