This was the case recently when 300 Arabian stokers made the dockfront the scene of an attempt to settle tribal differences finding their origin on the shores of the Red Sea. White dockers and sailors took their hands out of their pockets, spat on them, and leaped into the thick of it without asking whether it was a private battle or a free-for-all.

Four policemen came at a run and dutifully attacked the 300. Their truncheons made no impression on the mass, but they went on with their task. Knives began to flash, and brown-skinned Orientals were dishing through the dockyards seeking reinforcements of their clansmen. The Chamari tribesmen were setting an old grudge with the Alencose.

At the note of a whistle the four bobbies fell back to point 29 others who had come up in a motor-lorry. The 24 charged.
