### Umatilla Harvest Near End

**PENDLETON, Or.**—The wheat crop of Umatilla county is 80 per cent harvested, according to the estimate made by Fred Hession, county agent. A majority of growers have already completed their harvesting, and practically all of those who still have more wheat to harvest will get that done this week. The yields have been fairly good as they were last year, and when a bumper crop was harvested, most farmers agree. The production of the county over is thought to be above normal.

Notice is hereby given to all whom it may concern that the Commission of the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon, proposes and intends to improve Improvement District No. 128 in the City of La Grande, Oregon, in accordance with the plans and specifications therefore adopted by the Commission, and that the report of the committee on estimates for said improvement is now on file in the office of the Recorder of the City of La Grande, Oregon; that the said Commission has set Wednesday, the 19th, day of September, 1923, at 7:30 o'clock P. M., of said day, at the Commission Rooms in the City Building in La Grande, Oregon, as the time and place when and where said Commission will meet and hear and determine all objections, remonstrances and claims of grievance of any persons against said proposed improvement and the proposed assessment therefore against the property to be benefited thereby in said district. That the boundaries of the district to be improved and benefited by the said proposed improvement as finally adopted by the Commission are as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point which is the corner common to lots 2, 4, 9, and 10 in block 11, in Romig's Addition to the City of La Grande, Oregon; thence west along a line 175.7 feet from and parallel to the center line of Main Avenue to the center line of Alder Street; thence north along the center line of Alder Street to a point 212.5 feet north of the center line of Washington Ave. thence east along a line 212.5 feet from and parallel to the center line of Washington Avenue a distance of 150 feet; thence north along a line 150 feet from and parallel to the center line of Alder Street to the center line of Adams Avenue; thence east along the center line of Adams Avenue to a point 150 feet west of the center line of Oak Street; thence north on a line 150 feet from and parallel to the center line of Oak Street to the center line of Cedar Street to a point 212.5 feet north of the center line of Washington Avenue; thence east on a line 212.5 feet from and parallel to the center line of Washington Avenue a distance of 300 feet; thence south on a line 150 feet from and parallel to the center line of Spring Avenue; thence west along the center line of Spring Avenue a distance of 300 feet; thence north on a line 150 feet from and parallel to the center line of Alder Street to a point 185 feet south of the center line of Washington Avenue; thence west along a line 185 feet from and parallel to the center line of Washington Avenue a distance of 300 feet; thence south on a line 150 feet from and parallel to the center line of Spring Avenue; thence west along the center line of Spring Avenue a distance of 300 feet; thence north on a line 150 feet from and parallel to the center line of Alder Street to a point of beginning, all in the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon.
