## SPORT NEWS

### Greb Favorite In Battle For Wilson Crown

Middleweight Champion to Have Chance to Justify Title; Greb Is Fast and Wild; Wilson, Southpaw, Leads With Right.

NEW YORK.—The middle of the middleweight division will be untangled at the Polo Grounds tonight when Johnny Wilson and Harry Greb will meet in a fifteen-round bout with the championship title at stake. The affair either will establish Wilson as a legitimate champion at the weight, a matter of doubt in the minds of many, or bring Greb forward as the rightful successor to the title.

It will be the first meeting of these principals, although they were matched a year ago. On that occasion Wilson gave his contract the justly celebrated "run around" and was suspended and his title declared void, in consequence, by the New York State Athletic Commission. His reinstatement was delayed until such time as he received a desire to go through with the Greb contract.

Although it is said that he may experience some difficulty in making the required weight of 149 pounds, Greb is an almost prohibitive favorite. His speed, his unique style of attack and general aggressiveness are deemed to be sufficient to earn him a decision on points, a knockout by either man being a very remote possibility.

Wilson has held this title for several years in spite of the fact that many middleweights are imbued with the idea that he is made to measure. He fell heir to the championship by getting the decision over Mike O'Dowd in Boston, and subsequently made the verdict stand up by slapping Mike very silly in a return engagement at Madison Square Garden.

In one of his unguarded moments however, Wilson met up with one Bryan Downey out in Ohio and the latter claimed to have scored a seven-round knockout. But the champion had had the forethought to bring along what was alleged to be his own referee and the claim, if any, was disallowed. Wilson and Downey then met again at Jersey City, and the event proved to be nothing short of a public calamity. Downey was adjudged to have been the more astute of the two. The "run around" on the Greb engagement and the suspension of Wilson followed some months later.

Both of tonight's principals are unorthodox in style. Greb's tactics including everything, except hitting with flatiron. Wilson is a southpaw, fighting with the right hand and foot extended. Neither has the slightest claim to cleverness, but Greb has a big edge in speed and should outstep his man in the race for the final verdict.


