### Huggins Will Make A Third Try For Title

### Yankees Have Played Consistently This Year; Babe Ruth Has Been Chief Help in Race.

NEW YORK, (AP).—Slater Huggins, distinctive manager of the New York Yankees, will head the team this season in their third successive attempt to win the world's baseball championship. Though his personality has been overshadowed by the aggregation of Yankee stars, remembered as one of the greatest in diamond history, Huggins has earned a large share of the credit attached to the achievement of capturing three straight American league pennants. In 1921 and again in 1922, when his club won pennants but lost in the world's series to the New York Giants, Huggins was made the target of criticism by many baseball experts. They said Huggins was not strict enough with his men, that he could not rule them, that they did as they pleased. Cleveland gave the Yankees a hard fight for the pennant in 1921. The St. Louis Browns made a close race for it last year but this season the Yankees shied won by a margin that leaves no doubt of their superiority. Huggins' men have worked together in winning their third pennant. They played as a team, not the set of individual stars they seemed in 1921 and 1922. Babe Ruth, incorrigible as a 18-year-old schoolboy for two years, has been Huggins' greatest player this year. The pitching staff has been unqualified by any other in either league. Huggins has never won a world's series, but he is confident that he will enter the winning line this year. John McGraw of the Giants and Connie Mack of the Athletics each have won three world's series more than any other manager. McGraw won with the Giants against Mack's Athletics in 1906 and in 1921 and 1922 the Giant leader triumphed over Huggins' Yankees. Mack's Athletics won the series of 1910 from Frank Chance and the Chicago Cubs and in 1911 defeated McGraw's Giants. In 1912 Mack again won from McGraw. Frank Chance won two series with the Cubs, defeating the Detroit Americans, led by Hughie Jennings in 1907 and 1908. Bill Carrigan led the Boston Americans to victory in 1915 and 1916, vanquishing the Philadelphia Nationals in the first series and Brooklyn in the other. McGraw has led his team into action in more world's series than any other pilot, battling last season for the premier diamond title for the sev-

enth time. Mack engaged in five series. Winning and losing managers and clubs since 1905 follow:
